THE MEAT (RATIONING) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) (AMENDMENT NO. 5)
ORDER, 1954.

Made 17th February, 1954.

Coming into Operation ... 21st February, 1954.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Meat (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1953 (a) as amended (b) shall be further amended by adding at the end of Article 5, the following paragraph:-
 - "6. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order or in the Principal Order, where any retailer of meat products, being a Group IV Manufacturer, is supplied with pork by a duly authorised agent of the Committee free from any condition or stipulation that it be processed, that retailer may either process the pork or sell it unprocessed to any person ration free and any person may obtain any such pork from the retailer ration free."
2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.
3. This Order may be cited as the Meat (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment No. 5) Order, 1954, and shall come into operation on the 21st day of February, 1954.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This amending Order permits certain retailers who are Group IV Manufacturers (pork butchers) to sell ration free, unprocessed, any pork which is supplied to them by the Committee's authorised agent free from any requirement that it be processed.
