The Quarries (Safety) Regulations, 1954

Made 1st May, 1954.
Coming into operation ... 1st May, 1954.

The States Labour and Welfare Committee, as the Administering Authority constituted by the States under the Health, Safety and Welfare of Employees Law, 1950, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Quarries (Safety) Ordinance, 1954, hereby make the following Regulations:-

Interpretation

1. (1) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

(2) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:*

"the Factories Act" means the Factories Act, 1937;
"the Ordinance" means the Quarries (Safety) Ordinance, 1954;
"the Quarries General Regulations" means the Quarries General Regulations, 1938, dated June 29th, 1938, made by the Board of Trade under section eighty-six of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, as applied to Quarries by the Factories Act (S.R. & O. 1938, No. 632).

Registers

2. (1) The form of register to be kept under section twelve of the Ordinance in relation to the examination of all chains, ropes or lifting tackle shall be Form 3.

(2) The form of register to be kept under section twelve of the Ordinance in relation to the annealing of chains and lifting tackle (except rope slings) shall be Form 5.

(3) The form of register to be kept under section thirteen of the Ordinance in relation to the thorough examination of cranes and other lifting machines (excluding aerial cableways) shall be Form 4.

(4) The form of the general register to be kept under section forty-eight of the Ordinance shall be Form Q2.

Air Receivers

3. For the purposes of sub-section (5) of section fourteen of the Ordinance -
- (a) the form of report of the result of an examination of an air receiver shall be Form 59 prescribed by the Secretary of State under section thirty-one of the Factories Act and for the said purposes the reference in the said Form 59 to section thirty-one of the Factories Act shall be construed as a reference to section fourteen of the Ordinance; and the particulars to be contained on the said form shall be the particulars referred to on the said Form 59;
- (b) the form of supplementary report of the result of an examination of an air receiver shall be Form 60 prescribed by the Secretary of State under sections thirty and thirty-one of the Factories Act and for the said purposes the reference in the said Form 60 to sections thirty and thirty-one of the Factories Act shall be construed as a reference to section fourteen of the Ordinance; and the particulars to be contained on the said form shall be the particulars referred to on the said Form 60.

Aerial Cableways

4. For the purposes of section nineteen of the Ordinance the form of report in relation to the thorough examination of an aerial cableway shall be Form 10Q.

Notification of Accidents

5. For the purposes of sub-section (1) of section forty-three of the Ordinance the form of written notice of an accident to which that section applies shall be Form 1 prescribed by the Authority under section fifty-seven of the Safety of Employees (Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance, 1952, and for the said purposes the reference in the said Form 1 to section fifty-seven of the Safety of Employees (Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance, 1952, shall be construed as a reference to section forty-three of the Ordinance.

Daily Report Book

6. For the purposes of sub-section (6) of section forty-six of the Ordinance the form of report book shall be M. & Q. Form 94 prescribed under Regulation four of the Quarries General Regulations and for the said purposes any references in the said M. & Q. Form 94 to the Quarries General Regulations and to any provisions of those Regulations shall be construed as references to the Ordinance and to the corresponding provisions of the Ordinance respectively.
