IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1949,
AMENDMENT NO. 2 ORDER, 1954.

The Board of Administration, in pursuance of its powers under the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders as follows:-

1. The First Schedule to the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, (a), as amended, shall be further amended by the deletion therefrom of the following item -
"Butter"
2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
3. The Order shall come into force on the 13th May, 1954, and may be cited as the "Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, Amendment No. 2 Order, 1954".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The effect of the above Order is that as from 13th May, 1954, there will be no restrictions on the importation into Guernsey of butter from the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man.
