

## STATUTORY INSTRUMENT

1954 No. 38

*Revised by S.I. 1957 No 20*THE EXPORT OF BULBS ORDER, 1954

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by The Export of Bulbs Ordinance, 1953, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:-

1. The minimum period of notice to be given to the Inspector by a person desiring to export a consignment of bulbs shall be seventy-two hours.
2. The scale of charges in respect of the examination of bulbs made by the Inspector shall be:-
  - (a) for an examination occupying not more than half an hour on one day, five shillings;
  - (b) for an examination occupying more than half an hour on one day, at the rate of ten shillings an hour.
3. (1) The certificate required to accompany each consignment of bulbs exported, other than bulbs exported to the Island of Jersey, shall be in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order.  
(2) The certificate required to accompany each consignment of bulbs exported to the Island of Jersey shall be in the form set out in the Second Schedule to this Order.
4. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
5. This Order shall come into operation on the 12th June, 1954.
