THE PLANTS AND POTATOES IMPORTATION (NO. 2) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1954

The States of Guernsey Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by section six of the Plants and Potatoes Importation Ordinance, 1951, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby order:-

1. The Plants and Potatoes Importation (No. 2) Order, 1953 (a), shall be amended as follows:-

(i) in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (i) of section one thereof immediately after the word "rhododendrons" there shall be inserted the words "and rooted dahlia cuttings, grown under glass".

~~(ii) in paragraph (iii) of section one thereof immediately after the words "raw fruit" there shall be inserted the words "other than raw cherries".~~

(iii) immediately after section one thereof there shall be inserted the following additional section:-

"1 A (1) The landing or transshipment in this Island of raw cherries -

(i) from the United States of America or the Dominion of Canada shall be permitted;

(ii) grown in any country in the Continent of Europe other than Austria, Bulgaria, Hungary, Italy, Portugal, Southern France, Spain and Yugoslavia shall be permitted;

(iii) during the period beginning on the 1st day of October in any year and ending on the 31st day of May next following, both dates inclusive, grown in Portugal, Southern Italy or Spain shall be permitted;

(iv) during the period beginning on the 1st day of October in any year and ending on the 15th day of June next following, both dates inclusive, grown in Austria, Bulgaria, Hungary, Northern Italy, Southern France or Yugoslavia shall be permitted;

Provided that raw cherries grown in any country in the Continent of Europe shall not be landed or transhipped in this Island unless each consignment thereof is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Sixth Schedule to this Order.

(2) In this section:

"Northern Italy" comprises the regions of Val d'Aosta, Piemonte, Liguria, Lombardia, Alto Adige-Trentino, Veneto, Friuli-Venezia Giulia and Emilia-Romagna;

"Southern Italy" comprises those regions in Italy not included in the definition of Northern Italy;

"Southern France" means that part of European France south of latitude 46° North.

(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to raw cherries landed or transhipped in this Island from the United Kingdom, the Republic of Ireland, the Isle of Man, the Island of Jersey or another Island of this Bailiwick."

(iv) in section three thereof the words "or Fourth" shall be repealed and the words ", Fourth or Sixth" substituted therefor.

(v) in the Third Schedule thereto to the list of names set out in that Schedule there shall be added the following additional list of names:-

"Coleus	Pinguicula
Cycas revoluta	Salvia
X Genista	Stapelia"
Hedera canariensis	

(vi) immediately after the Fifth Schedule thereto there shall be inserted as the Sixth Schedule the Schedule to this Order.

2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
3. This Order shall come into operation on the 10th June, 1954.
