IMPORT DUTIES

THE IMPORT DUTIES (NO. 30) ORDER (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY), 1954,
DATED 29th JUNE, 1954, MADE BY THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION, BY
VIRTUE OF THE IMPORT DUTIES (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) LAWS, 1932 - 1953

WHEREAS the Import Duties (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Laws, 1932 to 1953, provide that (subject to the limitations therein provided) the Board of Administration may, by Order, direct that there shall be chargeable on goods imported into the Bailiwick such duties as may be specified in the Order;

AND WHEREAS the said Laws empower the said Board of Administration, by Order, to vary or revoke any duties chargeable by virtue of any previous Order;

Now, therefore, the Board of Administration, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the said Laws by resolution of the said Board of the 29th June, 1954, does hereby order as follows:-

1. The Appendix to the Import Duties (No. 25) Order (Bailiwick of Guernsey) 1951, dated 1st May, 1951, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:-

Part 3.

Group I

For sub-paragraphs vi and vii respectively of paragraph (2) there shall be substituted the sub-paragraphs so numbered set out in the First Schedule to this Order;

Group II

For paragraph (1) there shall be substituted the paragraph so numbered set out in the Second Schedule to this Order;

Group XVIII

For the word "Reeds" in head (d) of sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (26) there shall be substituted the words "Reeds, and need plates incorporating reeds".

Table A. (FOODSTUFFS)

For the words "from 1st April to 31st May" in sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (8) there shall be substituted the words "from 1st April to 30th June".

2. The provisions of the Import Duties (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Laws, 1932 to 1953, shall apply to all the articles set out in this Order and the Schedules to this Order and duty shall be charged thereon at the rates set out in that Order and those Schedules.
3. This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (No. 30) Order (Bailiwick of Guernsey) 1954.

4. This Order shall come into operation in the Islands of Guernsey and Alderney on the 1st day of July, 1954, and in the Island of Sark so soon thereafter as the provisions of the said Laws with reference to the putting into operation therein of this Order shall have been complied with.

The List of Exceptions to Group II (1):-

1. Rose stocks neither budded nor grafted, the following:-
 - Rosa canina rooted single stems, not less than 4 feet in length.
 - Rosa canina seedlings.
 - Rosa laxa seedlings.
 - Rosa rugosa rooted single stems, not less than 4 feet in length.
2. Fresh or dried vegetables (other than herbs) imported in a state such that they are not suitable for planting.
3. Dried plants, dried flowers and dried foliage, being plants, flowers or foliage of the kinds (when dried) used solely for the manufacture of drugs or medicines.
4. Dry bulbs, rhizomes, corms and tubers (but not including dahlia or other tuberous roots).
5. Lily of the valley crowns and roots.
6. Trees, shrubs, bushes and plants, the following:-
 - Azalea indica (not in flower).
 - Eroussonetia papyrifera (paper mulberry) and grafts on broussonetia papyrifera stock.
 - Cocos weddelliana.
 - Freesia, in flower, from 1st May to 31st August.
 - Kentia belmoreana (howea belmoreana).
 - Kentia forsteriana (howea forsteriana).
 - Phoenix canariensis.
 - Sweet bays.
7. Flowers and foliage, the following:-
 - Agrostis.
 - Cycas leaves.
 - Eryanthus.
 - Eulalia.
 - Freesia flowers, from 1st May to 31st August.
 - Golden palm.
 - Holly.
 - Lavender flowers (dried).
 - Magnolia leaves.
 - Mistletoe.
 - Pampas.
 - Stipa.
 - Topini (lagurus).
8. Dried chamomile flowers.

x. For the purpose of calculating this duty, the weight of any goods imported in earth or some other growing medium is their weight inclusive of that of the earth or other growing medium in which they are imported.
