IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946

THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1949

OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

Whereas by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated the 3rd August, 1949, (a), as amended, the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Board of Administration.

- (1) Now, therefore, the Board of Administration, in exercise of its powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, hereby authorises and permits:-
- (a) The importation into Guernsey from any country of all goods specified in Schedule I hereto.
 - (b) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule II hereto, if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Bolivia, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Ecuador, French Somaliland, Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philippines, Tangier, United States of America, Venezuela.
 - (c) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule III hereto, if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Persia (Iran), Philippines, Poland, Roumania, Tangier, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela.
 - (d) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule IV hereto, if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Persia (Iran), Philippines, Poland, Roumania, Tangier, United States of America, Venezuela.
 - (e) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule V hereto, if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba,

Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Persia (Iran), Philippines, Poland, Roumania, Spain (including the Balearic and Canary Islands), Spanish West Africa (including Fernando Po), Spanish Ports in North Africa, the Spanish Zone of Morocco, Tangier, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela.

- (f) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule VI hereto, if consigned from and originating in the Scheduled Territories, Muscat and Oman.
 - (g) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule VII hereto, if consigned from and originating in any part of the British Commonwealth, Burma or the Irish Republic.
 - (h) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule VIII hereto, if consigned from and originating in the particular countries referred to in such schedule.
 - (i) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule IX hereto according to the conditions contained in the said Schedule and provided they are not consigned from Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Persia (Iran), Philippines, Poland, Roumania, Tangier, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela.
 - (j) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule X hereto, if consigned from or taken and landed by vessels registered in such countries as are referred to in such schedule.
 - (k) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Schedule XI hereto, if consigned from any Scheduled Territory Muscat or Oman, and constructed solely from parts manufactured and assembled in any Scheduled Territory, Muscat or Oman.
 - (l) The importation into Guernsey of postage stamps and similar articles of philatelic interest, according to the conditions specified in Schedule XII hereto.
- (2) The Open General Licence dated the 23rd December, 1952 is hereby revoked.
- (3) This Licence shall take effect on the *28th July* 1954, and may be modified or revoked at any time by the Board of Administration.

PART B

Fruit, bottled (in water, syrup or spirituous liquor) and fruit, canned, of the following varieties:-

Grapefruit

Pineapple

and mixtures of these fruits may be imported without separate licences if consigned from any country or territory other than those listed in Part A of this Schedule, and grown and packed in that same country or territory.

Fruit pulp (including bulk frozen fruit) of the following varieties:-

Grapefruit

Pineapple

may be imported without separate licences if,

- (a) not containing more than 50 per cent by weight of commercial sweetening matter, viz., sugar, invert sugar, honey, molasses, solid or liquid glucose and all similar starch conversion products (e.g. malt syrup) and any mixtures of such materials, and
- (b) consigned from any country or territory other than those listed in Part A of this Schedule and derived from fruit grown in that same country or territory.

SCHEDULE X

Fish, fresh, frozen or preserved (not packed in airtight metal containers) taken by vessels registered in any country other than:-

Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Persia (Iran), Philippines, Poland, Roumania, Tangier, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela.

and not consigned from any of these specified countries.

Sea fish, fresh (other than frozen), and salmon, fresh or frozen, taken by vessels registered in Poland, and not consigned from any other country.

SCHEDULE XI

Goods which can be imported without separate licences if consigned from any Scheduled Territory, Muscat or Oman and if constructed solely from parts manufactured and assembled in any Scheduled Territory, Muscat or Oman.

Mechanically propelled road vehicles other than motor cycles and tri-cars.

NOTE.- The Scheduled Territories comprise the British Commonwealth (except Canada), British Trust Territories, British Protectorates and Protected States, Burma, the Irish Republic, Iraq, Iceland, Jordan and Libya.

SCHEDULE XII

Postage stamps and similar articles of philatelic interest may be imported without separate licences if consigned from:-

- (1) Any country, provided that no consideration, other than a consideration of other postage stamps and/or similar articles of philatelic interest, has been or will be given.
- (2) Any country other than:-
Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Hungary, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Persia (Iran), Philippines, Poland, Roumania, Tangier, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela;
provided that:-
 - (a) they are owned by a person normally resident in a country or territory other than a country or territory specified above, and
 - (b) any mint stamps issued by a country or territory specified above are consigned as part of a collection of mint and used stamps collected for philatelic reasons only.
