IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946, *force continued to have effect*

IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1949.

OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

Whereas by the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated the 3rd August, 1949, (a), as amended, the importation into Guernsey of goods consigned from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick or the Isle of Man is prohibited unless under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Board of Administration.

- (1) Now, therefore, the Board of Administration, in exercise of their powers under Article 2 of the above-mentioned Order, do hereby authorise and permit:-
  - (a) The importation into Guernsey from any country of all goods specified in Appendix I hereto.
  - (b) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Appendix II hereto if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El. Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Hungary, Iran, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philipines, Poland, Roumania, Tangier, United States of America, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Venezuela, Yugoslavia.
  - (c) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Appendix III hereto if consigned from and originating in any country or territory other than Albania, Argentina, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El. Salvador, French Somaliland, Germany (Russian Zone), Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Hungary, Iran, Japan, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philipines, Poland, Roumania, Tangier, United States of America, Venezuela, Yugoslavia.
  - (d) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Appendix IV hereto if consigned from and originating in the Scheduled Territories (which comprise the British Commonwealth (except Canada), British Trust Territories, British Protectorates and Protected States, Burma, the Irish Republic, Iraq, Iceland and Jordan), Muscat and Oman.
  - (e) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Appendix V hereto if consigned from any part of the British Commonwealth, Burma or the Irish Republic subject to the condition that a claim to Imperial Preference is established in respect of any customs duty to which the goods as a whole may be liable on importation into Guernsey.
  - (f) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Appendix VI hereto if consigned from the particular countries referred to in such Appendix.
  - (g) The importation into Guernsey of all goods specified in Appendix VII hereto if consigned from or taken and landed by vessels registered in such countries as are referred to in such Appendix.

- (2) The Open General Import Licence dated the 31st October, 1950, is hereby revoked.
- (3) This Licence shall take effect on the 1st January, 1953, and may be modified or revoked at any time by the Board of Administration.
