~~Expired~~The Plants and Potatoes Importation (No.2) Order, 1953.

The States of Guernsey Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by section six of the Plants and Potatoes Importation Ordinance, 1951, as amended, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order: -

1. The landing or transshipment in this Island from any country in the Continent of Europe, or from the United States of America or the Dominion of Canada of: -

(i) living plants and parts thereof for planting, other than seeds, flower bulbs, corms, tubers or rhizomes, shall be permitted provided that each consignment thereof is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order and by a certificate in the form set out in the Second Schedule to this Order, and provided also that, in respect of -

(a) the plants specified in the Third Schedule to this Order;

(b) buds of roses and grafts of apples, pears and rhododendrons; and ~~rooted dahlia cuttings grown under glass; and~~

(c) plants with bare or balled roots and cuttings or grafts of plants landed or transhipped between the sixteenth day of October of any year and the thirty-first day of March of the year next following, both dates inclusive,

the consignment may be accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule to this Order in place of the certificate in the form set out in the Second Schedule to this Order;

(ii) flower bulbs, corms, tubers or rhizomes shall be permitted provided that each consignment thereof is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order;

(iii) raw fruit shall be permitted provided that -

(a) in respect of raw apples from the United States of America each consignment thereof landed or transhipped between the seventh day of July and the fifteenth day of November of any year, both dates inclusive, is accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorised Inspector of the United States Department of Agriculture in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule to this Order;

(b) in respect of cider apples each consignment thereof landed or transhipped between the first day of April and the fifteenth day of October of any year, both dates inclusive, is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Second Schedule to this Order;

(iv) cucumbers, marrows, mushrooms and pumpkins shall be permitted;

- (v) raw vegetables, other than cucumbers, marrows, mushrooms and pumpkins shall be permitted provided that -
  - (a) in respect of the undermentioned raw vegetables each consignment thereof landed or transhipped between the first day of April and the fifteenth day of October of any year, both dates inclusive, is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule to this Order -

Root vegetables (excluding potatoes) free from foliage

Asparagus	Onions and Shallots
Aubergines	Pimentos
Green Beans	Tomatoes
Green Peas	Bitloof Chicory;

- (b) in respect of raw vegetables, other than those specified in the preceding sub-paragraph, each consignment thereof landed or transhipped between the first day of April and the fifteenth day of October of any year, both dates inclusive, is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Second Schedule to this Order;

(vi) nuts, cut flowers and mistletoe shall be permitted.

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2. The landing or transshipment in this Island of chrysanthemum plants shall be permitted provided that -

- (i) in respect of such plants from a country other than a country in the Continent of Europe or the United States of America or the Dominion of Canada each consignment thereof is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order;
- (ii) in respect of such plants from a country in the Continent of Europe or from the United States of America or the Dominion of Canada -

- (a) landed or transhipped between the sixteenth day of October of any year and the thirty-first day of March of the year next following, both dates inclusive, each consignment thereof is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order and by a certificate in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule to this Order; and
- (b) landed or transhipped between the first day of April and the fifteenth day of October of any year, both dates inclusive, each consignment thereof is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order and by a certificate in the form set out in the Second Schedule to this Order.

3. Where a certificate in the form set out in the First, Second ~~or~~ <sup>to which of them</sup> Fourth Schedules to this Order is required, under the provisions of this Order, to accompany a consignment, such certificate shall be signed by a duly authorised official of the Phytopathological Service of the country in which the plants included in the consignment were grown.

4. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to permit the landing or transshipment in this Island of any plants the landing or transshipment of which is prohibited under paragraphs (ii), (iii) and (iv) of section one of the Plants and Potatoes Importation Ordinance, 1951, as amended.
5. The General Licence (I.P.P.Gen.2/1951)(a), of the 24th day of February, 1951, and the Plants and Potatoes Importation Order, 1953(b), of the 5th day of February, 1953, shall be repealed.
6. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
7. This Order shall come into operation on the 12th May, 1953.

It is further certified that the consignment does not contain any plants of the genus Castanea, Populus, Quercus or Ulmus, or of the genera of the Order Pinaceae, viz., Abies, Larix, Picea, Pinus, Pseudotsuga, Sequoia, Thuja and Tsuga, or any plants of sugar beet or mangold (Beta vulgaris Linn.) except the seeds thereof.
