THE BACON (RATIONING) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1953.

REVOKED by S.I. 34 (1954)

Made ... 16th May, 1953.

Coming into Operation. ... 17th May, 1953.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. (1) In this Order -

"Appropriate coupon" means a coupon in any ration document being either -

- (a) a coupon which forms part of a row of coupons against which the word "Bacon" appears; or
- (b) a coupon upon which the word "Bacon" is marked.

"Bacon" includes hams and any other part of the carcase of a pig (excluding the offals, the feet and the head) which has been cured in any way but does not include -

- (a) chaps or chawls, fore-leg knuckles, hind-leg knuckles and the parts of shoulders known as "pionics";
- (b) cooked ham, cooked gammon, cooked boneless streak bacon and cooked boneless belly bacon;
- (c) bacon trimmings, including any facing or trimming or any end or remainder of any piece of bacon;
- (d) pickled pork;
- (e) canned bacon and canned ham.

Provided that bacon shall be deemed to include and pickled pork shall be deemed not to include any part of the carcase of a pig (except the offals, the feet and the head) which has been subjected to a dry curing process, or to a process of pickling for a period exceeding 48 hours, or which has matured after removal from pickle for a period exceeding 48 hours.

"The Principal Order" means the Food Rationing (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1953 (a).

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

- 2. Bacon is hereby declared to be a rationed food for the purposes of the Principal Order.
- 3. Article 2 of the Principal Order shall apply in respect of the obtaining of bacon by or the supply of bacon to retailers.
- 4. The maximum quantity of bacon (hereinafter referred to as "the bacon ration") which may be obtained or supplied for household consumption against any appropriate coupon shall be the amount ascertained in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule to this Order.

5. (1) An appropriate coupon for bacon numbered 1 in any ration document shall relate to the week beginning on the 17th day of May, 1953, and the coupons successively numbered in such ration document shall relate to the weeks thereafter in corresponding order. Any reference to any week so numbered in any ration document (other than a ration document relating to a period the whole or any part of which occurred prior to the coming into force of this Order) shall be construed accordingly.
 - (2) Any appropriate coupon for bacon in a General Ration Book R.B.1 or Child's Ration Book R.B.2 relating to any week shall be valid at any time during the ration period in which the week occurs.
 - (3) Any appropriate coupon for bacon in a Form R.B.12 shall be valid only during the period specified on the form (or in the case of a double form on that half of the form of which the coupon forms part).
 - (4) Any appropriate coupon in a Leave or Duty Ration Card R.B.8A shall be valid at any time prior to the expiration of seven days from the date marked on the card or, where more than one date is so marked, from the latest of such dates.
 - (5) Any appropriate coupon for bacon in a Weekly Seaman's Ration Book R.B.6 relating to any week shall be valid at any time, provided that the counterfoil in respect of that week shall have been duly signed and completed by the master or owner of the vessel upon which the holder is employed.
6. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order or in the Principal Order, where a surplus of ham or gammon bacon is held by a retailer, from bacon he is authorised by permit CP2 or Misc.2 to obtain for supply to his registered customers or to establishments as the case may be, after having supplied the lawful requirements of those customers and establishments the retailer may either -
- (a) cook the said surplus ham or gammon bacon and supply it ration free; or
 - (b) supply it ration free uncooked;
- and any person may obtain any such ham or gammon bacon ration free from the retailer.
7. (1) This Order shall come into operation on the 17th day of May, 1953.
- (2) This Order may be cited as The Bacon (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1953, and shall be construed as one with the Principal Order.

THE SCHEDULE.

Where a Form R.G.48 relating to bacon is produced with a ration document the amount of bacon obtainable during the period of validity of such form against each appropriate coupon for bacon in the ration document shall be increased as specified on the form.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order re-enacts the provisions of the Bacon (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, as amended, with alterations providing for the use of the new ration documents valid in respect of the rationing year commencing on 17th May, 1953.

This Order is to be construed as one with the Food Rationing (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1953. By virtue of the latter Order any bacon coupon in a Weekly Seaman's old Ration Book is valid during the first four weeks of the new rationing year provided the counterfoil is signed in the usual way.
