THE UTILITY APPAREL (MAXIMUM PRICES AND CHARGES) (BAILIWICK  
OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1952.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

Maximum Prices.

1. (1) The maximum prices to be charged in the course of the business of a retailer in respect of utility goods being apparel of a description and bearing a specification number specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be the amount therein specified in relation to that description and specification number with the addition of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent thereof.
- (2) The maximum prices to be charged in the course of the business of a retailer in respect of utility goods being apparel, other than -
  - (i) apparel to which paragraph 1 of this Article applies;
  - (ii) apparel for which retailers' maximum prices are for the time being fixed by an Order (other than this Order) made under Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945;
  - (iii) footwear of any description; or
  - (iv) apparel (other than gloves) made wholly or mainly of fur skin (including any skin with fur hair or wool attached);

shall be the aggregate of the following amounts:-

- (a) the price paid or agreed to be paid to the manufacturer or wholesaler, by the first purchaser, being a retailer;
- (b) an amount equal to the appropriate percentage of such price specified in Column 2 of the Second Schedule; and
- (c) an amount equal to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent of the aggregate of the foregoing amounts;

so, however, that in respect of goods of the descriptions specified in Column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto the maximum price of goods of a description specified in Column 1 of the appropriate Part of the relevant Related Schedule shall not exceed the appropriate amount specified in Column 3 of such Related Schedule, with the addition of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent of such amount.

Variations of Over-Riding Maxima.

2. The variations of over-riding maxima specified in the appropriate Parts of any Related Schedule shall have effect as therein respectively provided.

Rounding Provisions.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order -

On a sale by retail of goods -

- (a) the maximum price of which, computed in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order, does not exceed the sum of 5s., the maximum price shall be rounded to the nearest half-penny;
- (b) the maximum price of which, computed as aforesaid exceeds the sum of 5s., the maximum price shall be rounded to the nearest penny;

Provided that in respect of goods described in Column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto, the maximum price, when rounded, of goods of a description specified in Column 1 of the appropriate Part of the relevant Related Schedule shall not exceed the appropriate amount specified in Column 5 of such Related Schedule with the addition of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent of such amount.

Maximum Charges for Alteration Services.

- 4. (1) The maximum charge to be made in the course of the business of a retailer who performs the service of carrying out or contracting to carry out alterations to a garment, being goods sold by him, within a period of three months from the date of the sale thereof, shall be -
  - (i) in respect of a garment which was not made-to-measure:-
    - (a) the actual cost to the retailer of such alterations; or
    - (b) the sum of 15s.whichever shall be the less.
  - (ii) in respect of a garment which was made-to-measure, the sum of 1d.
- (2) All alterations to which this Article applies shall be separately charged
- (3) In this Article "a garment" means in relation to a garment comprising two or more articles, all such articles.

Interpretation and Revocation.

- 5. (1) In this Order -
  - (i) "A Related Schedule" means a Related Schedule (including any Supplement thereto) issued by the Board of Trade for the purposes of The Utility Apparel (Maximum Prices and Charges) Order, 1952, of the United Kingdom, or any Order revoked by that Order, and mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto;
  - (ii) "The Board of Trade" means the Board of Trade of the United Kingdom;
  - (iii) "Utility Goods" has the meaning assigned in The Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) Order, 1945, as amended, but does not include second-hand utility goods.
  - (iv) "Maximum price" means the price, from which the cost actually paid or incurred of delivering the goods may be excluded, payable before any deduction by way of discount;
  - (v) "Purchase price" means the price inclusive of all delivery charges payable after all deductions by way of discount other than cash or settlement discounts not exceeding 5 per cent;

- (vi) "Wholesaler" includes a manufacturer in respect of the sale of goods not of his own manufacture.
- (2) Each specification number specified in the First Schedule hereto or in any Related Schedule refers to utility goods to which that specification number has been applied in pursuance of an Order made by the Board of Trade.
- (3) Any reference in any Related Schedule to a specification number shall be deemed to include a reference to that number preceded by the letter "Z".
- (4) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.
6. The Orders specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto are hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.

Citation and Commencement.

7. This Order may be cited as The Utility Apparel (Maximum Prices and Charges) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, and shall come into operation on the 4th day of February, 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order supersedes the Utility Apparel (Maximum Prices and Charges) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1951, as amended.

It fixes retailers' maximum prices for all utility apparel other than that for which retailers' maximum prices are fixed by any other Order made under the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945.

The principal change is the omission of the references to Related Schedule No. 4N, which provided overriding maximum prices for women's and maids' utility underwear and nightwear, and Related Schedule No. 17B, which provided overriding maximum prices for women's utility domestic overalls and aprons. Retailers' maximum prices for the garments to which those Related Schedules referred are now fixed by two Orders which come into operation on the same date as this Order; those Orders are the Women's and Maids' Utility Underwear and Nightwear (Distributors' Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, and the Women's Utility Domestic Overalls and Aprons (Distributors' Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952.
