

## STATUTORY INSTRUMENT

1952 No. 48

THE INFANTS' AND CHILDREN'S GENERAL APPAREL (MAXIMUM PRICES)  
(BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1952.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. (1) The maximum price to be charged in the course of the business of an importer or a retailer on a sale of goods to which this Order applies, shall be computed in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.
- (2) The goods to which this Order applies (hereinafter referred to as "goods") are infants' and children's new apparel of a description specified in the First Schedule hereto, not being -
  - (i) goods to which the utility mark shown in the Third Schedule to the Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) Order, 1945, as amended, has been applied in pursuance of that or any other Order; or
  - (ii) goods the maximum prices of which are controlled by Orders (other than this Order) made under Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945; or
  - (iii) goods sold pursuant to an order placed in the United States of America or in the Dominion of Canada, and upon terms that payment is made in United States or Canadian dollars and that the goods are supplied to a person resident in the Bailiwick of Guernsey; or
  - (iv) apparel made wholly or mainly of fur skin; or
  - (v) overalls; or
  - (vi) headwear; or
  - (vii) braces, handwear, handkerchiefs, belts, collars, neckbands, cuffs or accessories to apparel.
2. The maximum price to be charged in the course of the business of an importer of goods in respect of such goods on a sale by retail shall be the aggregate of the following amounts:-
  - (a) the landed cost;
  - (b) an amount equal to the appropriate percentage thereof specified in column 3 of the First Schedule hereto; and
  - (c) an amount equal to 2½ per cent of the aggregate of the foregoing amounts.
3. The maximum price to be charged in the course of the business of a retailer in respect of goods shall be the aggregate of the following amounts:-
  - (a) the purchase price paid or agreed to be paid to the manufacturer, importer or wholesaler by the first purchaser, being a retailer;
  - (b) an amount equal to the appropriate percentage thereof specified in column 2 of the said First Schedule;

(c) an amount equal to  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent of the aggregate of the foregoing amounts; and

(d) the amount of import duty (if any) paid or payable in respect thereof.

4. Notwithstanding anything in this Order on a sale of goods by retail the maximum price computed in accordance with the appropriate foregoing provisions of this Order shall be rounded to the nearest halfpenny if that price does not exceed 5s. 0d. and to the nearest penny if that price exceeds 5s. 0d.

5. (1) In this Order -

"apparel" means garments, but does not include boots, shoes, overshoes, slippers or clogs;

"importer" means a person who imports goods to which this Order applies, from a place outside the Channel Islands, the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man;

"infants' and children's apparel" means such apparel of a kind suitable for young children's wear as is exempt from purchase tax in the United Kingdom;

"landed cost" means, in relation to the sale of imported goods, an amount equal to the aggregate of -

(a) the price (after all deductions by way of discount other than cash or settlement discounts not exceeding 5 per cent) paid or agreed to be paid by the importer; and

(b) all sums (in so far as they are not included under (a) above) paid or payable by the importer in respect of packing, insurance, freight to the port of entry, import duties and customs clearance charges;

"manufacture", which includes "making up", means, in relation to any person, the carrying out by that person in the course of his business of any process in the production of goods or the procuring by him in the course of his business of the carrying out of such a process in pursuance of a contract of work and labour (with or without the provision of materials); and

"manufacturer" has the corresponding meaning;

"maximum price" means the price from which the cost actually paid or incurred of delivering those goods to the customer may be excluded payable before any deduction by way of discount;

"purchase price" means the price after all deduction by way of discount, other than cash or settlement discounts not exceeding 5 per cent; and delivery charges may be included in the calculation of the purchase price of any goods except where the price of the goods purchased, or, if the goods were included in a parcel comprising other articles, the price of the parcel (exclusive of delivery charges) did not exceed £2.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

6. The Orders mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

7. This Order may be cited as the Infants' and Children's General Apparel (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, and shall come into operation on the 4th day of February, 1952.
