THE UTILITY LACE CURTAIN NET (DISTRIBUTORS' MAXIMUM PRICES) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1952.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The maximum price to be charged in the course of the business of a retailer on a sale of new utility goods being lace curtain net of any description specified in the Schedule hereto, shall be the appropriate amount specified in that Schedule in relation to that description with the addition of 2½ per cent thereof.
2. Each specification number specified in sub-column (a) of column 1 of the Schedule hereto refers to utility goods to which that specification number has been applied in pursuance of an Order made by the Board of Trade of the United Kingdom.
3. (1) In this Order -
"maximum price" means the price from which the cost actually paid or incurred of delivering those utility goods may be excluded payable before any deduction by way of discount;
"utility goods" has the meaning assigned in The Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) Order, 1945, as amended.
(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.
4. This Order may be cited as The Utility Lace Curtain Net (Distributors' Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of March, 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to inductate its general purport).

This Order fixes retailers' maximum prices for utility curtain net described in the Schedule. Retailers' maximum prices for such net, which have hitherto been fixed by The Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles (Distributors' Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, and computed by adding a percentage margin to the purchase price, are now to be computed by reference to the cash maximum prices set out in the Schedule to this Order.
