THE EXPORT OF TOMATOES (NO. 2) ORDER, 1952.

*Limited duration - expires*

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of section one of the Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, as extended by the Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, (Continuance) Law, 1951, for the purpose of ensuring the orderly and expeditious marketing of tomatoes from Guernsey in 1952, hereby orders:-

1. In this Order -

"the Board" means the Guernsey Tomato Shipping Board constituted under the provisions of the Export of Tomatoes Order, 1952;

"packer" has the same meaning as in the Export of Tomatoes Order, 1952.

2. A person who intends to pack tomatoes for export from Guernsey in 1952 shall apply to the Board for and be issued by the Board with a number identifying him.

3. The identification number issued by the Board in pursuance of section two of this Order shall be clearly stamped by the packer on both ends of the container of every package of tomatoes to be exported.

4. (1) All invoicing of tomatoes exported shall be done by the Board and all packers of such tomatoes shall render to the Board on an advice note supplied by the Board a record of their consignments stating the number of packages and the grade of tomatoes to be exported.

(2) The said advice note containing the said record shall be handed to the carter concerned who shall hand it in to a servant of the Board at the office of the Board at the White Rock at the time of the delivery of the tomatoes concerned to the Board.

5. (1) The Island shall, for the purposes of this Order, be divided into two zones, to be called the North Zone and the South Zone respectively and the boundaries of the said two zones shall be fixed by the States Committee for Horticulture.

(2) The Committee may, from time to time, by notice published in the Gazette Officielle, prescribe the days of shipment for tomatoes packed in the North Zone and for those packed in the South Zone.

6. All tomatoes shall be ready for collection at the packer's premises by 8 a.m. on the day of shipment.

7. (1) No person shall transport to the White Rock tomatoes intended for export other than under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence as a carter granted by the Board.

(2) The Board may at any time cancel such licence or impose such conditions upon the holding of it as it considers necessary.

(3) No person shall, without the permission of the Board, for the purpose of exporting tomatoes, use the services of more than one licensed carter during the year 1952.

8. Tomatoes shall only be exported in packages which are clean and in good condition.

9. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

10. This Order shall come into force on the first day of April, 1952, and shall cease to have effect on the 31st day of December, 1952.
