THE MEAT PRODUCTS (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1952.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey, excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

### Interpretation.

#### 1. (1) In this Order -

"The Committee" means the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities;

"Beef sausages" means sausages which are ordinarily known and sold as beef sausages and the casings of which are hog or sheep casings, and includes sausages, the meat in which is not beef alone;

"Beef sausage meat" means sausage meat which is ordinarily known and sold as beef sausage meat and includes sausage meat, the meat in which is not beef alone;

"Brawn" means the article of food ordinarily known and sold as brawn and in which the meat consists, to the extent of not less than one-third, of pig's head meat and pork trimmings;

"Buy" includes offer or agree to buy, and "sell" includes offer or agree to sell or expose for sale;

"Canned" means packed in a tin, jar or other airtight container by any means involving the application of heat whether before, during, or after packing in the container; provided that any reference to a canned meat product shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be deemed to refer also to that meat product after removal from the original container;

"Catering business" includes the business or undertaking of an inn, public house, hotel, restaurant, buffet, coffee stall, or of any place of refreshment open to the public, or of any club, boarding house, refreshment contractor or canteen, and the expression "caterer" shall be construed accordingly;

"Chap" means the lower portion of a pig's head severed horizontally at the line of the mouth and including the tongue;

"Continental or fancy sausages" include frankfurter and vienna sausages;

"Cooked" means subjected to a process of cooking throughout the whole substance so as to render unnecessary any further cooking before being used for human consumption;

"Excepted product" means any item listed in the First Schedule to this Order;

"Eye-piece" means the upper portion of a pig's head after the chap has been severed, and with the brain removed;

"Home produced" means manufactured in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands;

"Imported" means imported into the Bailiwick of Guernsey from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands but does not include direct imports from France;

"Imported canned offal" means a product in which the only meat ingredient is edible offal other than tongue;

"Meat" means bacon, ham, beef, mutton, lamb, veal, pork, and edible offals, whether raw, cooked, smoked or otherwise processed or prepared;

"Meat content" means the percentage of the weight of all meat when raw contained in any quantity of a meat product relative to the total weight of that quantity; provided that, for the purposes of this definition, the weight of any cooked meat product shall be the weight of the product when cooked;

"Meat product" means any food, other than soup, used, manufactured or prepared for human consumption which is manufactured or prepared from meat and another ingredient or other ingredients, and includes meat which has been both pressed and cooked;

Provided that the use of fat of any meat in the manufacture or preparation of any vegetable or fish product shall not be deemed to make that product a meat product;

"Milk powder" means skin milk powder;

"Open meat product" means any meat product which is not and has not been canned;

"Pig's head meat" means meat obtained from a pig's head, but does not include chaps or eye-pieces;

"Pork sausages" means sausages which are ordinarily known and sold as pork sausages, and the casings of which are hog or sheep casings;

"Quick-frozen meat meal" means any open meat product which is sold in a cooked and frozen state;

"Salami sausages" means smoked or dried sausages which are ordinarily known and sold as salami sausages and which contain no ingredient in addition to meat except salt, spices or other flavouring matter;

"Sale by retail" means any sale to a person buying otherwise than for the purpose of resale, and includes any sale to a person for the purposes of his catering business, and the expression "retailer" shall be construed accordingly;

"Sale by wholesale" means any sale other than a sale by retail and the expression "wholesaler" shall be construed accordingly;

"Sausage" means any meat product filled into a natural or artificial casing not being a loose wrapper or container;

"Slicing sausage" means uncooked beef sausage meat or uncooked pork sausage meat, whether filled or not filled into a natural or artificial casing or loose wrapper or container, and ordinarily known and sold as slicing sausage.

"Specified food" means -

- (a) in relation to open meat products any article of food specified in the Second or Fourth Schedules to this Order;

(b) in relation to canned meat products any article of food specified in the Third or Fifth Schedules to this Order.

"Substance" includes a liquid;

"Tongue" means, except where otherwise specified, ox, calf, pig, sheep and lamb tongues;

"Whaleneat product" means any product used or prepared for human consumption which is prepared from whaleneat whether with or without another ingredient, but does not include whale oil, whale liver oil, vitamin concentrates or pharmaceutical products.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

Restriction on Manufacture and Sale.

2. A person shall not by way of or in the course of trade or business manufacture or prepare or cause or permit to be manufactured or prepared, or sell or cause or permit to be sold, any meat product except -

- (a) any specified food;
- (b) any excepted product.

Meat Content of Specified Food.

3. A person shall not by way of trade prepare or manufacture or sell or have in his possession for sale any description of specified food the meat content of which is less than the minimum meat content prescribed in respect of such specified food -

- (1) up to and including the 13th day of September, 1952, in Column 2 of the Second or Third Schedules hereto;
- (2) on and after the 14th day of September, 1952, in Column 2 of the Fourth or Fifth Schedules hereto.

Restriction on the Use of Offals.

4. A person shall not by way of trade prepare or manufacture or sell or have in his possession for sale, any uncooked open meat product containing any of the following offals, namely:- brains, feet, fries, gut (including chitterlings) manifolds, paunches, udders, sweetbreads, tripe, melts or lites, spinal cord and uteri.

Chap, Eye-Piece and Pig's Head.

- 5. (1) A person shall not sell or have in his possession for sale any chap or eye-piece unless the chap or eye-piece has been cured, and not less than four days have elapsed from the commencement of the process of curing.
- (2) A person shall not produce a cured chap or cured eye-piece except from a pig's head which has either -
  - (a) been previously skinned; or
  - (b) been previously scalded or singed and has had all the bristles removed.

Maximum Prices.

6. A person shall not sell or buy any specified food except in accordance with the prices applicable in respect of such specified food -
- (1) up to and including the 13th day of September, 1952, as set out in the Second and Third Schedules hereto;
  - (2) on and after the 14th day of September, 1952, as set out in the Fourth and Fifth Schedules hereto:

Provided that the said prices specified in the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Schedules shall be subject to such additions as are applicable in accordance with the Sixth Schedule hereto.

Uncooked and Cured Tongue.

7. On a sale of uncooked cured tongue the maximum price shall be calculated on the weight of the tongue after the brine or pickle has been allowed to drain off for a period of not less than half an hour.

Statement of Net Weight.

8. (1) The net weight of any canned meat product stated upon the container thereof, or upon the label or wrapper of that container, shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be the net weight of the contents of the container:

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to any such meat product sold otherwise than in the original container.

- (2) A person shall not, with intent to deceive, remove, alter or render illegible any statement of net weight appearing on the container of any canned meat product or upon the label or wrapper of that container.

Farthings.

9. In calculating the maximum price of any specified food on a sale by retail any fraction of a farthing shall be regarded as one farthing.

Caterers.

10. This Order -

- (a) shall not, with the exception of Articles 3 and 4, and paragraphs (3), (4) and (5) of Article 12, apply to the preparation or manufacture by a caterer in the course of his catering business of any meat product to be served by him as a meal or part of a meal;
- (b) shall not apply to any sale by a caterer in the course of his catering business of any article of food served by him as a meal or part of a meal.

Tickets or Labels.

11. Any person who exposes for sale by retail any sausage or sausage meat shown in the Second or Fourth Schedules shall clearly indicate the description of the sausage or sausage meat by means of a ticket or label attached or displayed in close proximity thereto so as to be legible by intending purchasers.

Records and Invoices.

12. (1) Every person who carries on any undertaking by way of trade or business in the course of which he sells by wholesale any specified food, shall keep or cause to be kept an accurate record of all sales and purchases by him of any such article of food, that record to include in respect of each purchase or sale the name and address of the person from whom the specified food was purchased or to whom it was sold, particulars of the quantity and description thereof purchased or sold, of the price paid or charged, and of each and every addition made to the maximum price.

- (2) Every person who carries on any undertaking by way of trade or business in the course of which he sells by retail any specified food shall keep or cause to be kept an accurate record of all purchases by him of any such article of food, that record to include in respect of each purchase the name and address of the person from whom the specified food was purchased and particulars of the quantity and description thereof, of the price paid or charged, and of each and every addition to the maximum price.
- (3) Every person who carries on any undertaking by way of trade or business in the course of which he manufactures or prepares any pork sausages, pork sausage meat, pork slicing sausage, beef sausages, beef sausage meat or beef slicing sausage, shall keep or cause to be kept an accurate record of all such sausages, slicing sausage or sausage meat manufactured or prepared by him.
- (4) Retention by any person of an invoice or of a copy of an invoice shall, as respects the particulars mentioned in that document, be a sufficient compliance by that person with the provisions of this Article.
- (5) Every person who is required by this Article to keep any record shall retain it for a period of not less than one year from the date of the transaction to which it relates, or in case of a record of stocks, from the date to which the record relates.
- (6) Where the maximum price of any meat product has been increased by any addition permitted in the Sixth Schedule, that sum shall be separately stated upon an invoice which shall be furnished by the seller to the buyer on the occasion of any sale.

Defences.

13. (1) Where in any prosecution a person is charged with an infringement of any provision of this Order in relation to any article it shall be a defence for the defendant to prove -
  - (a) that he purchased that article with a written warranty to the effect that it complied with the provision in question; and
  - (b) that he had no reason to believe at the time of the commission of the alleged offence that the article in question was not as warranted.
- (2) A warranty shall not be a defence to such proceedings unless the defendant has, within seven days of the service of the summons, sent to the prosecutor a copy of the warranty with a notice stating that he intends to rely on it, and specifying the name and address of the person from whom he received it, and has also sent a like notice of his intention to that person.
- (3) Where the defendant is a servant of the person who purchased the article in question under a warranty, he shall be entitled to rely upon the provisions of this Article in the same way as his employer would have been entitled to do if he had been the defendant.
- (4) The person by whom the warranty is alleged to have been given shall be entitled to appear at the hearing and to give evidence.
- (5) For the purposes of this Article any statement in an invoice or similar document relating to any article mentioned in that invoice or document, or on a label affixed to the wrapper or container of any such article shall in respect of that article be deemed to be a written warranty as to the matters mentioned in the statement.

Evidence of Analysis.

14. (1) In any proceedings in respect of an infringement of this Order in which the composition of any article of food is in question, the production by one of the parties of (i) a document purporting to be a certificate of the States Analyst, or (ii) a document supplied to him by the other party as being a copy of such a certificate shall be sufficient evidence of the facts stated therein, unless in the case mentioned under head (i) above the other party requires that the person making the analysis shall be called as a witness.

(2) In any such proceedings -

(a) if the prosecution intends to produce a certificate of the States Analyst, a copy of such certificate shall be served with the summons; and

(b) if a defendant intends to produce a certificate of the States Analyst, or to require that the person making the analysis shall be called as a witness, he shall give to the other party at least three clear days' notice of his intention,

and if any of these requirements is not complied with, the court may, if it thinks fit, adjourn the hearing on such terms as it deems proper.

Artificial Transactions and Unreasonable Charges.

15. A person shall not in connection with the sale or disposition or proposed sale or disposition of any article of food to which this Order relates, enter or offer to enter into any artificial transaction or make or demand any unreasonable charge.

Directions, Authorisations and Licences.

16. (1) The provisions of this Order are subject to -

(a) any direction which may at any time be given by or on behalf of the Committee; and

(b) any licence or authorisation which may be granted under this Order by or on behalf of the Committee.

(2) Every person holding a licence or authorisation granted under this Order shall comply with every condition imposed by that licence or authorisation.

Infringements.

17. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945.

Revocation.

18. The Meat Products and Canned Meat (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1951, dated 21st July, 1951 (a) is hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.

Citation and Commencement.

19. This Order may be cited as The Meat Products (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, and shall come into operation on the 24th day of March, 1952.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Excepted Products.

1. Any open meat product of a character usually sold under any of the following descriptions:-

faggots, rissoles, hamburgers, savoury ducks, black puddings, white puddings, hogs puddings, meat pies, meat puddings, sausage rolls, meat pasties, haslet or aislet, salami sausages, liver sausages, pressed maws, pressed chitterlings, quick-frozen meat meals, meat paste, meat extract, potted meat, cured chaps, cured eye-pieces, cured pig's head meat, brawn, haggis, cooked pig's feet, cow heel, and sandwiches made with a meat product.

2. Canned meat products of the following descriptions:-

canned brawn, canned meat paste, canned potted meat, canned meat extract, canned haggis and imported canned offal other than tongues.

3. Any meat product prepared for medicinal or pharmaceutical purposes.
4. Any meat product used or manufactured or prepared for other than human consumption.
5. Any whalemeat product clearly labelled and sold as such.
6. Any canned ham, canned gammon or canned shoulder of pork.
7. Any meat product for which a price is prescribed in an Order made under Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, prescribing prices for bacon.
8. Any meat product with a meat content of less than 20 per cent.

THE SIXTH SCHEDULE.

Part I - Permitted Additions to the Maximum Prices Prescribed  
in the Second and Fourth Schedules.

Sausages in Sheep Casings.

1. On a sale of any pork sausages or beef sausages filled in sheep casings and sold at not less than ten to the pound weight, the maximum price may in each case be increased by a sum not exceeding 1d. per lb.

Slicing.

2. No additions to the maximum retail prices shown in Columns 4 and 7 of the Second or Fourth Schedules shall be made in respect of slicing, except in the case of a meat product for which a price on a sale by retail in slices is shown in Columns 5 and 8 of the appropriate Schedule.

Delivery.

3. The maximum price on a sale by wholesale includes all costs and charges of and incidental to delivery by the seller at the buyer's premises and no additional charge shall be made on any such sale for or in respect of transport or delivery.

Containers.

4. The maximum prices include all costs and charges in respect of packing and packages or containers and no additional charge shall be made by the seller in respect thereof.

Part II - Permitted Additions to the Maximum Prices Prescribed  
in the Third and Fifth Schedules.

Delivery.

1. The maximum prices prescribed in the Third and Fifth Schedules on a sale by wholesale include all costs and charges of and incidental to delivery by the seller at the buyer's premises, and no additional charge may be made for or in respect of delivery.

Breaking Bulk.

2. Where on a sale by wholesale the number of tins sold, or at the buyer's request delivered to him, is less than the number contained in the case or package in which those tins were delivered to the seller, the maximum price may be increased by a sum not exceeding 1d. per dozen tins.

Non-specified Sizes of Tin.

3. The maximum price per tin on a sale of any description of meat products specified in Column 1 of the Third and Fifth Schedules and packed in a tin of a size other than a size specified in the said column in respect of that description shall be a sum calculated at the rate per lb. corresponding to the maximum price per tin of that description of meat product.

Sale in portions or slices.

4. (a) On a sale by retail of a portion or slice of any meat product specified in Column 1 of the Third or Fifth Schedule, and in respect of which a price on a sale by retail in portions or slices is shown in Columns 5 and 8 of the said Schedule, the maximum price may be increased to the amount shown in Columns 5 and 8:

Provided that -

- (i) the original container from which any such meat product is removed shall be of a capacity not less than 1 lb.; and
  - (ii) no additional charge may be made for or in respect of slicing or cutting.
- (b) Except as provided by para. (a) above the maximum price chargeable for any description of meat product sold otherwise than in the original container shall not exceed the maximum price chargeable for that description when sold in the original container.

SEVENTH SCHEDULE.

Provisions regarding the Composition of Specified Foods.

1. Specified foods marked "(a)" shall consist only of the appropriate meat or meats with the optional addition of salts, curing agents, gelatine, spices or flavourings not exceeding in all 5 per cent by weight.
2. Specified foods marked "(b)" shall contain, in respect of their meat content, not less than one-half pork or ham as the case may be.
3. Specified foods marked "(c)" shall contain no cereal or cereal product.
4. Any skim milk powder used in the manufacture of a specified food marked "(d)" shall be deemed to be equivalent to  $\frac{5}{3}$  of its own weight in meat for the purpose of assessing the meat content of the food, provided that the quantity of such milk powder so used does not exceed 6 per cent of the total weight of the food.
5. The meat content of any specified food marked "(e)" shall consist, to the extent of not less than 80 per cent, of pork.
6. In assessing the meat content of a specified food marked "(f)", any fat of vegetable origin used in its manufacture shall be deemed to be meat for this purpose, provided the total quantity of such fat so used does not exceed 25 per cent of the prescribed minimum meat content.
7. The meat content of any specified food marked "(g)" shall consist entirely of pork.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order replaces The Meat Products and Canned Meat (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1951, and continues the prohibition on the manufacture and sale of meat products other than specified or excepted products.

The principal changes are:

- (1) The prices of most meat products are increased.
- (2) Certain additional meat products are now freed from control, including haggis, liver sausage, brawn, cooked pigs' feet, cow heel, canned rabbits and canned poultry.
- (3) From 14th September, 1952, the minimum meat content requirements are extended to the majority of meat products.
- (4) From 14th September, 1952, price control is extended to include certain imported meat products, including pork in natural juice, jellied veal, jellied pork and continental or fancy sausages.

(5) Home manufacturers may now produce all types of meat product that may be imported except canned bacon, canned ham rashers and canned offal other than tongues.

(6) The restriction on the use of soya is removed.
