THE CONTROL OF AVIATION SPIRIT (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY)
ORDER, 1952.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. (1) No person shall supply to, or acquire from, any other person any aviation spirit for use in civil aviation if the total quantity of aviation spirit supplied by him to, or acquired by him from, that person during the period of operation of this Order exceeds or would thereby exceed sixty-five per centum of the total quantity of aviation spirit supplied by him to, or acquired by him from, that person during the month of April, 1952.
- (2) Nothing in this Order shall apply to the supply or acquisition of aviation spirit -
 - (a) in pursuance of a licence granted by the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities authorising the supply thereof; or
 - (b) by importation into the Bailiwick of Guernsey.

(3) In this Order -

"aviation spirit" means light hydrocarbon oil having an octane number higher than eighty as determined by the Motor Method of test relating thereto set out in "Standard Methods for Testing Petroleum and its Products" (Eleventh Edition, 1951) published by the Institute of Petroleum, being Method I.P. 44/51 (tentative).

2. This Order may be cited as the Control of Aviation Spirit (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1952, and shall come into operation on the 12th day of May, 1952, and shall cease to have effect on the 9th day of June, 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

By this Order supplies of aviation spirit by and to any persons are restricted during the period of four weeks beginning on 12th May, to 65 per cent of the supplies by and to those persons during the month of April, subject to certain exceptions specified in Article 1 (2).
