THE FAMILY ALLOWANCES (GUERNSEY) (GREAT BRITAIN RECIPROCAL ARRANGEMENTS) REGULATIONS, 1952.

Made 6th September, 1952.

Coming into Operation ... 2nd September, 1952.

Laid before the States

The States Insurance Authority, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Family Allowances (Guernsey) Law, 1950, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:-

1. - (1) These regulations may be cited as the Family Allowances (Guernsey) (Great Britain Reciprocal Arrangements) Regulations, 1952, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 2nd day of September, 1952.

(2) Words and expressions in these regulations shall have the same meaning as in the Memorandum of Reciprocal Arrangements set out in the Schedule hereto.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

2. The provisions contained in the Memorandum of Reciprocal Arrangements set out in the Schedule hereto shall have full force and effect so far as the same relate to Guernsey, and the Family Allowances (Guernsey) Laws, 1950 and 1951, shall have effect subject to such modifications and adaptations of the provisions thereof as may be requisite for giving effect to the provisions contained in the said Memorandum or in consequence thereof.

3. The States Insurance Authority may make such financial adjustments as it and the Minister of National Insurance, with the consent of the Treasury, may agree to be necessary in consequence of the provisions contained in the said Memorandum.

THE SCHEDULE

MEMORANDUM OF RECIPROCAL ARRANGEMENTS relating to Family Allowances made between the Minister of National Insurance, with the consent of the Treasury, of the one part, and the States Insurance Authority, with the consent of the States of Guernsey, of the other part.

1. - (1) This Memorandum is supplementary to and shall be read as one with the Memorandum of Reciprocal Arrangements relating to Family Allowances dated the 14th day of June 1951 and made between the parties to this Memorandum.

(2) In this Memorandum, unless the context otherwise requires -

"the principal Memorandum" means the said Memorandum dated the 14th day of June, 1951;

"the Great Britain Acts" means the Family Allowances Acts, 1945 and 1952;

"the Guernsey Laws" means the Family Allowances (Guernsey) Laws, 1950 and 1951;

and other words and expressions shall have the same meanings as in the principal Memorandum.

(3) The arrangements set out in this Memorandum shall apply for the same purposes as the arrangements set out in the principal Memorandum and shall have effect as from the 2nd day of September, 1952.

2. So long as the rate of an allowance under the Great Britain Acts exceeds the rate of an allowance under the Guernsey Laws, an allowance under the Great Britain Acts which would, but for the provisions of the principal Memorandum, be paid in respect of a child as being included in a family, may, notwithstanding those provisions, be paid in respect of that child: Provided that where in accordance with the provisions of the principal Memorandum an allowance under the Guernsey Laws has been paid for any week in respect of any such child, the rate at which any allowance under the Great Britain Acts shall be payable for that week shall not exceed the difference between the respective rates of allowance under the Great Britain Acts and the Guernsey Laws.
