THE MEAT PRODUCTS (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) (NO. 2) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1952.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Meat Products (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No. 2) Order, 1952 (a) shall be amended as follows:-
  - (a) For the words "the 13th day of September, 1952" where they occur in Articles 3 and 6 thereof there shall be substituted the words "the 31st day of December, 1952";
  - (b) For the words "13th September, 1952" where they occur at the head of the Second and Third Schedules thereto there shall be substituted the words "31st December, 1952";
  - (c) For the words "the 14th day of September, 1952" where they occur in Articles 3 and 6 thereof there shall be substituted the words "the 1st day of January, 1953";
  - (d) For the words "14th September, 1952" where they occur at the head of the Fourth and Fifth Schedules thereto there shall be substituted the words "1st January, 1953".
2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.
3. This Order may be cited as the Meat Products (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No. 2) (Amendment) Order, 1952, and shall come into operation on the 7th day of September, 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This amending Order extends until 31st December, 1952, the operation of the Second and Third Schedules, which specify maximum prices and minimum meat contents for certain open pack meat products and canned meats, and postpones until the 1st January, 1953, the operation of the Fourth and Fifth Schedules which provide for some amendments of prices and meat contents which would otherwise have come into operation on the 14th September, 1952.
