THE ADVERTISEMENT LIGHTING (PROHIBITION) (GUERNSEY) ORDER,  
1951.

As Competent Authority as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, I hereby make the following Order as regards the Island of Guernsey:-

1. (1) In this Order -

"The Committee" means the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.

2. (1) Except under the authority of a licence granted by the Committee under this Order, no person shall, between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9 a.m., cause or allow the use for the purpose of advertisement in the course of any business, of any lighting fitting which occasions the use of electricity, gas or oil, or of candles.

(2) For the purposes of this Article the expression "advertisement" shall be construed as including the display of any article in the course of any business.

(3) Nothing in this Article shall restrict the use of -

(a) any lighting fitting solely using electricity obtained from a windmill; or

(b) any lighting fitting in a theatre or cinema duly licensed as such for the purpose of projecting any film or slide on to a screen.

3. This Order may be cited as The Advertisement Lighting (Prohibition) (Guernsey) Order, 1951, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1951.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order prohibits the use, between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9 a.m., for the purpose of advertisement in the course of any business, of any lighting fitting which occasions the use of electricity (other than electricity obtained from a windmill), gas or oil, or of candles. The Order does not apply to any lighting fitting in a theatre or cinema duly licensed as such for the purpose of projecting any film or slide on to a screen.
