

THE EXPORT OF TOMATOES 1951, No. 2. ORDER.

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of The Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, as extended by the Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, (Continuance) Law, 1950, for the purpose of ensuring the orderly and expeditious marketing of tomatoes from Guernsey in 1951 hereby orders:-

1. For the purpose of this Order:- "The Board" means the Guernsey Tomato Shipping Board constituted under the provisions of The Export of Tomatoes 1951 Order.  
  
The expression "packer" shall have the same meaning as in The Export of Tomatoes 1951 Order.
2. Any person packing tomatoes for export from Guernsey must previously apply for and be issued with a number identifying him. This identification number will be issued by the Board.
3. The packer's identification number must be clearly stamped by the packer on the end of the container of every package to be exported.
4. All invoicing of tomatoes exported shall be done by the Board and all packers of such tomatoes must render to the Board on an advice note supplied by the Board, a record of their consignments stating the number and grade of tomatoes to be exported. The said record shall be handed to the carter concerned who shall hand it in to the office of the Board at the White Rock at the time of the delivery of the tomatoes concerned to the Board.
5. For the purpose of this Order, the Island is divided into two zones, North and South. Tomatoes packed in one zone will be, for the start, shipped on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays only, those packed in the other zone will be shipped on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays only. The zones will alternate as regards permitted shipping days from time to time as directed by the States Committee for Horticulture. Any modifications which may be required from time to time shall be made at the discretion of the Committee.
6. All tomatoes must be ready for collection at the packer's premises by 8 a.m. on the day of shipment.
7. (a) No person shall transport tomatoes intended for export to the White Rock other than under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence as a carter granted by the Board. The Board may at any time cancel such licence or impose such conditions upon the holding of it as it considers necessary.  
  
(b) No person shall, without the permission of the Board, for the purpose of exporting tomatoes, use the services of more than one carter during the year 1951.
8. Tomatoes shall only be exported in packages which are clean and in good condition.
9. This Order shall come into force on the first day of April, 1951.
