IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946.

THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1949.
AMENDMENT NO. 2 ORDER, 1951.

The Board of Administration, in pursuance of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders as follows:-

1. There shall be deleted from the Second Schedule to the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated 3rd August, 1949, (a), the following item:-

"Flower bulbs, that is to say, bulbs, corms or rhizomes normally cultivated for their bloom or blossom, in consignments of more than 56 lbs."
2. There shall be deleted from the Delegation of Power to Grant Export Licences (No. 1) Order, 1949, dated 8th August, 1949, (b), the following words:-

"For Flower Bulbs, to the States' Committee for Horticulture".
3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
4. This Order shall come into force on 6th July, 1951, and may be cited as "The Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, Amendment No. 2 Order, 1951."
