As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

PART I.

INTERPRETATION.

Definitions.

1. (1) In this Order -

"The Committee" means the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities;

"Beef sausages" means sausages which are ordinarily known and sold as beef sausages and the casings of which are hog or sheep casings, and includes sausages, the meat in which is not beef alone;

"Beef sausage meat" means sausage meat which is ordinarily known and sold as beef sausage meat and includes sausage meat, the meat in which is not beef alone;

"Buy" includes offer or agree to buy, and "sell" includes offer or agree to sell or expose for sale;

"Canned" means packed in a tin, jar or other airtight container by any means involving the application of heat whether before, during, or after packing in the container; provided that any reference to a canned meat product or to any canned meat shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be deemed to refer also to that meat product or meat after removal from the original container;

"Catering business" includes the business or undertaking of an inn, public house, hotel, restaurant, buffet, coffee stall, or of any place of refreshment open to the public, or of any club, boarding house, refreshment contractor or canteen, and the expression "caterer" shall be construed accordingly;

"Chap" means the lower portion of a pig's head severed horizontally at the line of the mouth and including the tongue;

"Excepted product" means any open meat product of a character usually sold under any of the following descriptions:-

faggots, rissoles, savoury ducks, black puddings, white puddings, hogs puddings, meat pies, meat puddings, sausage rolls, meat pasties, haslet or aislet, ravioli, imported salami sausages, pressed maws, pressed chitterlings, imported quick-frozen meat meals, meat paste and any extract usually known as and called "meat extract";

"Eye-piece" means the upper portion of a pig's head after the chap has been severed, and with the brain removed;

"Home-canned" means canned in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands;

"Imported" means imported into the Bailiwick of Guernsey from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands but does not include direct imports from France;

"Imported canned meat" includes imported canned meat products which contain not less than 20 per cent by weight of meat;

"Imported quick-frozen meat meal" means any open meat product as defined by this Order which has been imported in a frozen and cooked state;

"Luncheon meat" means any imported minced pork or minced ham product or any imported product containing both minced pork and minced beef, not otherwise specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order;

"Meat" means bacon, ham, beef, mutton, lamb, veal, pork, edible offals, poultry, game, rabbit, hare, venison, and goat's flesh, whether raw, cooked, smoked or otherwise processed or prepared;

"Meat content" means the percentage of the weight of all meat when raw contained in any quantity of a meat product relative to the total weight of that quantity: provided that, for the purposes of this definition, the weight of any cooked meat product shall be the weight of the product when cooked, except that in the case of cooked pork sausages, cooked pork sausage meat, cooked beef sausages and cooked beef sausage meat, the weight thereof shall be the weight of the product before being cooked;

"Meat paste" means any edible paste containing meat and usually known as "meat paste" but does not include any extract usually known as and called "meat extract";

"Meat product" means any food, other than soup, used, manufactured or prepared for human consumption which is manufactured or prepared from meat and another ingredient or other ingredients: Provided that the use of fat of any meat as defined by this Order in the manufacture or preparation of any vegetable or fish product, shall not be deemed to make that product a meat product;

"Milk powder" means skim milk powder;

"Open meat product" means any meat product which is not and has not been canned;

"Pig's head meat" means meat obtained from a pig's head, but does not include chops or eye-pieces;

"Pork sausages" means sausages which are ordinarily known and sold as pork sausages, and the casing of which are hog or sheep casings;

"Ready or prepared meal" includes all home-canned meat products except meat extract, meat paste, meal roll, galantine, tongue, sausage, bacon and solid pack;

"Sale by retail" means any sale to a person buying otherwise than for the purpose of resale, and includes any sale to a person for the purposes of his catering business, and the expression "retailer" shall be construed accordingly;

"Sale by wholesale" means any sale other than a sale by retail, and the expression "wholesaler" shall be construed accordingly;

"Sausage" means any meat product filled into a natural or artificial casing not being a loose wrapper or container;

"Slicing sausage" means uncooked beef sausage meat or uncooked pork sausage meat, whether filled or not filled into a natural or artificial casing or loose wrapper or container, and ordinarily known and sold as slicing sausage;

"Solid pack" means, in relation to home-canned meat products, any jellied pork, jellied veal, or jellied pork and veal, whether stuffed or not;

"Soya product" means a product produced by milling soya beans;

"Specified food" means -

(a) in relation to open meat products and to cured, pressed or cooked meat, any article of food specified in column 1 of Parts I, II and III of the Second Schedule to this Order, and cooked pork sausages, cooked beef sausages, and cooked pork or beef sausage meat;

(b) in relation to home-canned meat and home-canned meat products, any article of food specified in column 1 of Parts I and II of the Third Schedule to this Order;

"Substance" includes a liquid;

"Tongue", except where otherwise specified, includes ox, calf, pig, sheep and lamb tongues;

"Whale meat product" means any product used or prepared for human consumption which is prepared from whale meat whether with or without another ingredient, but does not include whale oil, whale liver oil, vitamin concentrates or pharmaceutical products.

- (2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

PART II.

OPEN MEAT PRODUCTS AND COOKED MEAT.

(1) Control.

Restriction on manufacture and sale.

2. A person shall not by way of or in the course of trade or business manufacture or prepare or cause or permit to be manufactured or prepared, or sell or cause or permit to be sold, any open meat product except -
- (a) any specified food or excepted product;
  - (b) any meat product prepared for medicinal or pharmaceutical purposes, or any meat product used or manufactured or prepared for other than human consumption.
  - (c) any whale meat product clearly labelled and sold as such.

Meat content.

3. A person shall not by way of trade prepare or manufacture or sell or have in his possession for sale any description of specified food mentioned in Column 1 of the First Schedule to this Order the meat content of which is less than the minimum meat content prescribed as respects that description in Column 2 of the said Schedule:

Provided that -

- (i) any milk powder used in the manufacture of pork sausages, pork sausage meat and pork slicing sausage and beef sausages, beef sausage meat and beef slicing sausage shall be deemed to be equivalent to  $\frac{5}{3}$  of its own weight in meat for the purpose of assessing the meat content of any of the said products, if the quantity of such milk powder so used does not exceed 6 per cent of the total weight of the product, and
- (ii) any fat of vegetable origin used in the manufacture of beef sausages, beef sausage meat, or beef slicing sausage shall be deemed to be meat for the purpose of assessing the meat content of any of those products, if the total quantity of such fat so used does not exceed 25 per cent of the prescribed minimum meat content of the product.

Restriction on use of soya product and offals.

4. (1) A person shall not use or cause to be used any soya product in the preparation or manufacture by way of trade of any sausage, slicing sausage, or sausage meat, or sell or have in his possession for sale any sausage, slicing sausage, or sausage meat which to his knowledge contains any soya product.
- (2) A person shall not use or cause to be used in the preparation or manufacture by way of trade of any sausage, slicing sausage, or sausage meat any of the following offals, namely:- brains, feet, fries, gut (including chitterlings), manifolds, paunches, udders, sweetbreads, tripe, melts or lites, spinal cord and uteri.

Chaps, eye-pieces and pig's heads.

5. (1) A person shall not sell or have in his possession for sale any chap or eye-piece unless the chap or eye-piece has been cured, and not less than four days have elapsed from the commencement of the process of curing.
- (2) A person shall not produce a cured chap or cured eye-piece except from a pig's head which has either -
  - (a) been previously skinned; or
  - (b) been previously scalded or singed and has had all the bristles removed.
- (3) A person shall not buy or sell any cooked, cured or otherwise processed pig's head or pig's head meat:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall prohibit the sale or purchase of any such pig's head meat which is a specified food mentioned in Part I or Part III of the Second Schedule to this Order or an excepted product or an ingredient of any such specified food or excepted product.

(2) Maximum Prices.

Maximum prices.

6. A person shall not sell or buy any specified food mentioned in Column 1 of Parts I, II and III of the Second Schedule to this Order at a price exceeding the maximum price applicable in accordance with the said Schedule.

Uncooked cured tongues.

7. On a sale of uncooked cured tongue the maximum price shall be calculated on the weight of the tongue after the brine or pickle has been allowed to drain off for a period of not less than half an hour.

PART III.

CANNED MEAT PRODUCTS AND CANNED MEAT.

1. HOME-CANNED MEAT PRODUCTS AND HOME-CANNED MEAT.

(1) Control.

General restriction on canning of meat and meat products.

8. A person shall not by way of or in the course of trade or business can or cause or permit to be canned any meat, either alone or with any other substance, except any specified food, whale meat product or meat paste or any extract usually known as and called "meat extract".

Restriction on canning and sale of specified foods.

9. A person shall not by way of or in the course of trade or business can or cause or permit to be canned any specified food, or sell or have in his possession for sale any canned specified food, unless that food -
  - (1) is packed in a container in respect of which a maximum price for that food is prescribed in Part I of the Third Schedule to this Order;
  - (2) is, if packed in a glass container, packed to the practical limit of capacity of the container; and
  - (3) except in the cases of meat paste and tongue, is manufactured in accordance with a specification approved by or on behalf of the Committee or by or on behalf of the British Minister of Food.

Retail sales of canned specified food in slices.

10. A person shall not sell any canned specified food otherwise than in the original container; provided that he may sell by retail in slices -
- (a) any meat roll, galantine or solid pack, which has been canned in a tin containing not less than 2 lb. net weight;
  - (b) any tongue.

(2) Maximum Prices.

Maximum prices.

11. A person shall not sell or buy any home-canned specified food (whether in the original container or removed therefrom in accordance with the provisions of Article 10 of this Order) at a price exceeding the maximum price applicable in accordance with the Third Schedule to this Order.

2. IMPORTED CANNED MEAT.

Maximum prices.

12. A person shall not sell or buy any imported canned meat at a price exceeding the maximum price applicable in accordance with the provisions of the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

Restriction on sales.

13. A person shall not sell or buy any imported canned meat for which a maximum price is not prescribed by this Order, or, as the case may be, for which a fixed or maximum price is not prescribed by any Order made by the Committee prescribing fixed or maximum prices for bacon.

Statement of net weight.

14. (1) The net weight of any imported canned meat stated upon the container thereof, or upon the label or wrapper of that container, shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be the net weight of the contents of the container:

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to any such meat sold otherwise than in the original container.

- (2) A person shall not, with intent to deceive, remove, alter or render illegible any statement of net weight appearing upon the container of any imported canned meat or upon the label or wrapper of that container.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

Caterers.

15. This Order -

- (a) shall not with the exception of Articles 3 and 4 and paragraphs (3), (4) and (5) of Article 18 apply to the preparation or manufacture by a caterer in the course of his catering business of any meat product to be served by him as a meal or part of a meal;
- (b) shall not apply to any sale by a caterer in the course of his catering business of any article of food served by him as a meal or part of a meal.

Tickets or labels.

16. Any person who exposes for sale by retail any uncooked beef or pork sausages or sausage meat or beef or pork slicing sausage, shall clearly indicate the description of the sausages, sausage meat or slicing sausage by means of a ticket or label attached or displayed in close proximity thereto so as to be legible by intending purchasers.

Farthings.

17. In calculating the maximum price of any specified food or any imported canned meat on a sale by retail any fraction of a farthing shall be regarded as one farthing.

Records.

18. (1) Every person who carries on any undertaking by way of trade or business in the course of which he sells by wholesale any specified food or imported canned meat, shall keep or cause to be kept an accurate record of all sales and purchases by him of any such article of food, that record to include in respect of each purchase or sale the name and address of the person from whom the specified food or canned meat was purchased or to whom it was sold, particulars of the quantity and description thereof purchased or sold, of the price paid or charged, and of each and every addition made to the maximum price.
- (2) Every person who carries on any undertaking by way of trade or business in the course of which he sells by retail any specified food or any imported canned meat shall keep or cause to be kept an accurate record of all purchases by him of any such article of food, that record to include in respect of each purchase the name and address of the person from whom the specified food or canned meat was purchased, and particulars of the quantity and description thereof, of the price paid or charged, and of each and every addition to the maximum price.
- (3) Every person who carries on any undertaking by way of trade or business in the course of which he manufactures or prepares any pork sausages, pork sausage meat, pork slicing sausage, beef sausages, beef sausage meat or beef slicing sausage, shall keep or cause to be kept an accurate record of all such sausages, slicing sausage, or sausage meat manufactured or prepared by him.
- (4) Retention by any person of an invoice or of a copy of an invoice shall, as respects the particulars mentioned in that document, be a sufficient compliance by that person with the provisions of this Article.
- (5) Every person who is required by this Article to keep any record shall retain it for a period of not less than one year from the date of the transaction to which it relates, or in the case of a record of stocks, from the date to which the record relates.

Defences.

19. (1) Where in any prosecution a person is charged with an infringement of any provision of this Order in relation to any article it shall be a defence for the defendant to prove -
- (a) that he purchased that article with a written warranty to the effect that it complied with the provision in question; and
- (b) that he had no reason to believe at the time of the commission of the alleged offence that the article in question was not as warranted.

- (2) A warranty shall not be a defence to such proceedings unless the defendant has, within seven days of the service of the summons, sent to the prosecutor a copy of the warranty with a notice stating that he intends to rely on it, and specifying the name and address of the person from whom he received it, and has also sent a like notice of his intention to that person.
- (3) Where the defendant is a servant of the person who purchased the article in question under a warranty, he shall be entitled to rely upon the provisions of this Article in the same way as his employer would have been entitled to do if he had been the defendant.
- (4) The person by whom the warranty is alleged to have been given shall be entitled to appear at the hearing and to give evidence.
- (5) For the purposes of this Article any statement in an invoice or similar document relating to any article mentioned in that invoice or document, or on a label affixed to the wrapper or container of any such article shall in respect of that article be deemed to be a written warranty as to the matters mentioned in the statement.

Evidence of analysis.

20. (1) In any proceedings in respect of an infringement of this Order in which the composition of any article of food is in question, the production by one of the parties of (i) a document purporting to be a certificate of the States Analyst, or (ii) a document supplied to him by the other party as being a copy of such a certificate shall be sufficient evidence of the facts stated therein, unless in the case mentioned under head (i) above the other party requires that the person making the analysis shall be called as a witness.
- (2) In any such proceedings -
  - (a) if the prosecution intends to produce a certificate of the States Analyst a copy of such certificate shall be served with the summons; and
  - (b) if a defendant intends to produce a certificate of the States Analyst or to require that the person making the analysis shall be called as a witness, he shall give to the other party at least three clear days' notice of his intention,

and if any of these requirements is not complied with, the court may if it thinks fit, adjourn the hearing on such terms as it deems proper.

Artificial transactions and unreasonable charges.

21. A person shall not in connection with the sale or disposition or proposed sale or disposition of any article of food to which this Order relates, enter or offer to enter into any artificial transaction or make or demand any unreasonable charge.

Directions, authorisations and licences.

22. (1) The provisions of this Order are subject to -
  - (a) any direction which may at any time be given by or on behalf of the Committee; and
  - (b) any licence or authorisation which may be granted under the Order by or on behalf of the Committee.

(2) Every person holding a licence or authorisation granted under this Order shall comply with every condition imposed by that licence or authorisation.

Infringements.

23. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945.

Revocations.

24. The following Orders are hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof:-

Commencement and citation.

25. This Order may be cited as The Meat Products and Canned Meat (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1951, and shall come into force on the 23rd day of July, 1951.

Part IV - Permitted Additions to the Maximum Prices prescribed in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule.

1. Sheep Casings.

On a sale of any pork sausages or beef sausages filled in sheep casings and sold at not less than ten to the pound weight, the maximum price may in each case be increased by a sum not exceeding 1d. per lb.

Part III - Various Provisions.

1. Delivery.

The maximum prices prescribed in Part I of this Schedule on a sale by wholesale include all costs and charges of and incidental to delivery by the seller at the buyer's premises and no additional charge on any such sale shall be made for or in respect of delivery.

2. Containers and Slicing.

The maximum prices prescribed in Part I of this Schedule include all costs and charges in respect of packing and packages or containers and no additional charge shall be made by the seller in respect thereof. No addition to the prices prescribed in Part II of this Schedule shall be made for or in respect of slicing or cutting into portions.

3. Breaking Bulk.

Where on a sale by wholesale, the number of tins of a canned specified food sold or at the buyer's request delivered to him, is less than the number contained in the case or package in which those tins were delivered to the seller, the maximum price of that food may be increased by a sum at a rate not exceeding 1d. per dozen tins.

Part II - Permitted Additions to the Maximum Prices Prescribed  
in Part I of this Schedule.

1. The maximum prices prescribed in Part I of this Schedule on a sale by wholesale, include all costs and charges of and incidental to delivery by the seller at the buyer's premises, and no additional charge may in either case be made for or in respect of delivery.
2. (1) On a sale by retail of any portion or slice -
  - (a) of roast or boiled beef, mutton or pork, the maximum retail price may be increased to 2s. 4d. per lb.;
  - (b) of luncheon meat, pork loaf, ham loaf, or veal loaf, the maximum price may be increased to 4s. per lb.;
  - (c) of lunch tongue, the maximum price may be increased to 5s. 4d. per lb.;
  - (d) of brisket or pressed beef, the maximum price may be increased to 3s. 6d. per lb.;
  - (e) of ox tongue or calf tongue, the maximum price may be increased to 7s. per lb.

Provided that -

  - (i) the original container from which any such imported canned meat is removed shall, except in the case of luncheon meat, pork loaf, ham loaf, and veal loaf, be of a capacity exceeding 1 lb.; and
  - (ii) not more than 1 lb. of any such description of imported canned meat is sold on the occasion of any sale.
- (2) No additional charge may be made for or in respect of slicing or cutting into portions.
3. Except as provided by paragraph 2 hereof, the maximum price chargeable for any description of imported canned meat sold otherwise than in the original container shall not exceed the maximum price chargeable for that description when sold in that container.
4. Where on a sale by wholesale the number of tins sold, or at the buyer's request delivered to him, is less than the number contained in the case or package in which those tins were delivered to the seller, the maximum price may be increased by a sum not exceeding 1d. per dozen tins.
5. Where the maximum price of any imported canned meat has been increased by any sum under paragraph 4 of these provisions, that sum shall be separately stated upon an invoice which shall be furnished by the seller to the buyer on the occasion of any sale.
6. The maximum price per tin on a sale of any description of imported canned meat specified in Section B of column 1 of Part I of this Schedule, and packed in a tin of a capacity other than a capacity specified in the said section in respect of that description shall be a sum calculated at the rate per lb. corresponding to the maximum price per tin of that description of canned meat.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order which revoked and re-enacts in a consolidated form, the provisions of The Meat Products and Canned Meat (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1949, as amended -

- (1) increases the maximum prices of all open-pack and home-canned meat products;
- (2) increases the maximum prices of certain imported canned meats;
- (3) removes canned bacon and canned sausages from the Schedule of home-canned meat products.
