THE MEAT (RATIONING) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) (AMENDMENT)  
ORDER, 1951.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Meat (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1951 (a) shall be amended by substituting for paragraphs 1, 2 and 4 of the Schedule thereto (which specifies the amount of the meat ration) the following paragraphs:-

1. Amount against the appropriate coupons relating to each week in a -

General Ration Book	( ls. 3d. maximum price (7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. maximum retail price for each coupon) or where the meat supplied is pork produced in the Bailiwick of Guernsey 2s. 10d. maximum price (ls. 5d. maximum retail price for each coupon).

2. Amount against each appropriate coupon in a -

Child's Ration Book	( 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. maximum retail price or where the meat supplied is pork produced in the Bailiwick of Guernsey ls. 5d. maximum retail price.

Ration Book R.B.7.	
Leave or Duty Ration Card R.B.8A.	

4. Amount against an appropriate coupon on a Form R.G.44.	( ls. 10d. maximum retail price."

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 1 of this Order or in Article 4 (1) of The Meat (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1951, the maximum quantity of meat which may be obtained or supplied against an appropriate coupon for meat in any of the ration documents mentioned in Article 1 of this Order relating to the week beginning 15th July, 1951, and valid for use during that week and the following week, but not used during the said week beginning 15th July, 1951, shall be ls. 10d. maximum retail price in the case of any appropriate coupon on a form R.G.44 and 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. maximum retail price in any other case.

3. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

4. This Order may be cited as The Meat (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment) Order, 1951, and shall come into operation on the 22nd day of July, 1951.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order amends The Meat (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1951.

In consequence of the increase in the maximum retail prices of meat as from 22nd July, 1951, the value of the meat coupon on a form R.G.44 has been increased from that date from 1s. 7d. to 1s. 10d. maximum retail price. Any such coupon for the week beginning 15th July, 1951, but not used in that week is valid if used in the week beginning 22nd July, 1951, for 1s. 10d. maximum retail price.

This Order also increases as from the 22nd July, 1951, the amount of the meat ration which may be obtained against appropriate coupons in a Ration Book R.B.1 and Form R.B.12 from 1ld. to 1s. 3d. or where the meat supplied is locally produced pork from 2s. 8d. to 2s. 10d. maximum retail price. The value of the appropriate coupons in the Child's Ration Book R.B.2, Ration Book R.B.7 and Leave or Duty Ration Card R.B.8A is increased from 5½d. to 7½d. or where the meat supplied is locally produced pork from 1s. 4d. to 1s. 5d. maximum retail price.

Consequent upon the increase in the maximum retail price of meat, each coupon for meat in Ration Books R.B.1, R.B.2 and R.B.7 and Leave or Duty Ration Cards R.B.8A for the week beginning 15th July, 1951, but not used in that week, is valid, if used in the week beginning 22nd July, 1951, for 6½d. maximum retail price.
