Revocation Order

IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946.

THE IMPORTATION OF PIGS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) (REVOCATION) ORDER,
1950.

The Board of Administration, in pursuance of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders as follows:-

1. The Importation of Pigs (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated the 4th day of June, 1949, is hereby revoked.
2. This Order shall come into force on the 12th day of January, 1950, and may be cited as the "Importation of Pigs (Control) (Guernsey) (Revocation) Order, 1950".

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The effect of the above Order is that pigs may now be imported into Guernsey from the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man without restriction in so far as import licensing control is concerned. Would-be importers are reminded, however, of other requirements of the Law for the time being in force relating to the importation of pigs.
