 IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946.

The Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949,  
 Amendment No. 1. Order, 1950.

The Board of Administration in pursuance of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders as follows:-

- (1) The Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated the 3rd August, 1949, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:-
- (i) There shall be deleted from sub-paragraph (2)(b) of Article 6 the word "and".
  - (ii) There shall be added after the word "otherwise" in sub-paragraph (2)(c) of Article 6 the word "and".
  - (iii) There shall be added to Article 6 the following sub-paragraph (2)(d):-
 

"(2)(d) such gifts if imported from the Republic of Ireland shall not contain canned fruits, dried fruit, table jellies, chocolate confectionery or sugar confectionery."
- (2) This Order shall come into force on the 17th day of January, 1950, and may be cited as "The Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, Amendment No. 1 Order, 1950".

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The effect of the above Order is to prohibit the importation of gift parcels from the Republic of Ireland which contain canned fruits, dried fruit, table jellies and chocolate and sugar confectionery. Any parcel containing such food-stuffs arriving in Guernsey from the Republic of Ireland after the 16th January, 1950, will be confiscated and under no circumstances will an Import Licence be issued or return to the sender permitted.
