THE FOOD (LICENSING OF WHOLESALERS) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY)

ORDER, 1950.

REVOKED by S.I. 64 (1954)

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. In this Order -

"The Committee" means the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities;

"Establishment" means a catering establishment or institution licensed or deemed to be licensed as such under The Food (Licensing of Establishments) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1948, as amended;

"Manufacturer" means a person carrying on a business, not being an establishment, in the course of which food is processed or preserved, or used in the composition, manufacture or preparation of any article;

"Sale by wholesale" in relation to any specified food means any sale to a person buying for resale and includes any sale of such food to an establishment or manufacturer, and "sell by wholesale" shall be construed accordingly;

"Sell" includes offer or agree to sell and "buy" includes offer or agree to buy;

"Specified food" means any food specified in the Schedule to this Order and, unless this Order otherwise provides, where any specified food is described or defined in any Order of the Committee for the time being in force, such description or definition shall apply for the purposes of this Order, provided that where any such description or definition is contained in more than one Order of the Committee the description or definition, as the case may be, which is contained in any Order regulating maximum, minimum or fixed prices for any such food shall apply for the purposes of this Order.

2. Except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence granted under this Order, no person shall sell any specified food by wholesale, and no person shall buy any specified food by wholesale, except from a holder of such a licence granted in respect of that food.
3. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945.
4. (1) The provisions of this Order are subject to any directions which may at any time be given by or on behalf of the Committee, and to any licence or authorisation which may be granted by or on behalf of the Committee under this Order.
(2) Every person holding a licence or authorisation granted under this Order shall comply with every condition imposed by such licence or authorisation.
5. (1) Nothing in this Order shall, except as otherwise provided, operate to affect the provisions of any other Order of the Committee for the time being in force.

(2) This Order shall not apply in respect of the sale by wholesale of any specified food by any person who sells principally to persons (other than establishments or manufacturers) buying otherwise than for resale.

6. The Food (Licensing of Wholesalers) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1947, is hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof, provided that any licence or authorisation granted or having effect under that Order, and subsisting immediately before the coming into force of this Order, shall continue to have effect as though granted under this Order.
7. This Order may be cited as The Food (Licensing of Wholesalers) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 15th day of January, 1950.

THE SCHEDULE.

Biscuits, rusks and crispbreads.
Butter.
Canned fish.
Canned fruit.
Canned meat and canned meat products, other than meat paste.
Cheese as defined in The Fats, Cheese and Tea (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1949, as amended.
Chocolate, chocolate confectionery and chocolate couverture.
Condensed milk.
Dried fruits.
Potatoes.
Rice.
Sugar.
Sugar confectionery.
Syrup and treacle.
Table jellies.
Vegetables, fresh (imported).

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order replaces The Food (Licensing of Wholesalers) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1947. It substantially reduces the number of foods in respect of which a licence to sell by wholesale is required.
