GENERAL LICENCE DATED 4TH FEBRUARY, 1950, MADE BY THE
STATES OF GUERNSEY COMMITTEE FOR THE CONTROL OF ESSENTIAL
COMMODITIES UNDER THE FLOUR CONFECTIONERY (CONTROL AND
MAXIMUM PRICES) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1947.

Pursuant to Article 12 of The Flour Confectionery (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1947, the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities hereby issues the following Licence:-

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of The Flour Confectionery (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1947 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order) the maximum price of any cake in which the combined fat, sugar and dry egg solids content amounts to 40 per cent or more and which is wholly covered on the top, or on the top and sides, with sugar icing and almond marzipan and which is substantially decorated, shall be calculated at a rate not exceeding four times the cost of the edible ingredients (to which may be added the actual cost, to the manufacturer of the cake, of any inedible decoration or ornamentation) or 5/- per lb. net (including the cost and the weight of any inedible decoration or ornamentation) whichever is the lesser: provided that such cake is supplied for use in connection with the celebration of a christening or a wedding including a silver, golden or diamond wedding.
2. For the purpose of ascertaining the maximum price under paragraph 1 of this Licence where some or all of the edible ingredients were supplied by the person to whom the cake is sold by the manufacturer, the value of the ingredients so supplied (such value to be determined as provided in Article 4 (2) of the Principal Order) shall be deducted from four times the cost of all the ingredients (with the addition of the cost of any inedible decoration or ornamentation); and in any such case the maximum price shall be calculated at a rate not exceeding the amount arrived at after making such deduction or 5/- per lb. net whichever is the lesser.
3. This Licence shall come into operation on the 7th February, 1950.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Licence but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Licence provides that cakes supplied for use in connection with the celebration of a christening or a wedding including a silver, golden or diamond wedding which are of a prescribed standard and are both iced and decorated, may be sold at any price up to four times the cost of the edible ingredients plus the actual cost of any inedible ornaments, provided that the total price does not exceed 5s. 0d. a pound.

Special provision is made for those cases in which some or all of the ingredients of the cake are supplied by the customer.
