The Export of Tomatoes (Grading) (Amendment)
Order, 1950.

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of The Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, as extended by the Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, (Continuance) Law, 1949, and in pursuance of the Resolution of the States of the 22nd March, 1950, hereby order: -

- No. 24 of 50.

1. The Export of Tomatoes (Grading) Order, 1950 (a) shall be amended as follows: -
 - (a) For sub-paragraph (f) of paragraph 2 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph -

"(f) In the case of tomatoes other than those graded as PINK the container must be marked by two labels affixed to opposite ends thereof, each clearly identifying the tomatoes as of their appropriate grade."
 - (b) Immediately after paragraph 4 there shall be inserted the following paragraphs -
 - "4A. The maximum penalty which may be imposed upon any person contravening this Order is, in the case of a first contravention, a fine of twenty pounds, or in the case of any subsequent contravention, a fine of one hundred pounds.
 - 4B. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment."
2. This Order shall come into force on the second day of May, 1950.
