The Export of Tomatoes (Nailing of Lids) Order, 1950.

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of the Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, for the purpose of ensuring the orderly and expeditious marketing of tomatoes from Guernsey in 1950, hereby orders:-

1. (a) "Commencing Wednesday, 14th June, 1950, the lids on all 12 lb. tomato chips presented for export must be fastened with two nails at the end of each piece constituting the lid.
- (b) The fastening of lids with staples will not be permissible.
2. The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment".

Explanatory Note. It is found that large numbers of lids are becoming unfastened during transit when staples are used. This is largely due to the timber being too hard for staples.
