THE UTILITY FOOTWEAR (MAXIMUM PRICES) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY)
ORDER, 1950.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The maximum price to be charged in the course of the business of a retailer in respect of footwear described in Column 1 and bearing a code number included in Column 2 of the First Schedule hereto, being utility goods (which footwear is in this Order referred to as "goods") shall be the appropriate amount specified in Column 3 of that Schedule.
2. The amount specified in Column 3 of the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be adjusted as follows:-
 - (i) in relation to women's and men's footwear, each such amount shall be deemed to be increased -
 - (a) in respect of any of the fittings set out in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto by the appropriate percentage of such amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule, and, in addition,
 - (b) in respect of any of the sizes set out in Column 1 of the said Second Schedule by the appropriate percentage of such amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule;
 - (ii) in relation to goods marked "substandard", each such amount, increased in accordance with the provisions of head (i) of this Article (where applicable), shall be deemed to be reduced by 20 per cent thereof.

3. (1) In this Order -

"maximum price" means the price payable before any deductions by way of discount except that in calculating the maximum price to be charged on a sale of any goods by retail, the cost actually paid or incurred of delivering those goods to the buyer thereof may be excluded;

"utility goods" has the meaning assigned thereto in The Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) Order, 1945.

- (2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

4. The following Orders are hereby revoked:-

The Utility Footwear (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1948, dated 14th February, 1948.

The Utility Footwear (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment) Order, 1948, dated 27th September, 1948.

The Utility Footwear (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No. 2) Order, 1949, dated 24th September, 1949 (a).

5. This Order may be cited as The Utility Footwear (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 3rd June, 1950.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order supersedes The Utility Footwear (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (No. 2) Order, 1949. ^{S.I. 92 of 1949}

The principal changes are as follows:-

- (1) Hitherto retailers' maximum prices were computed by adding permitted margins to the price paid by the first purchaser, being a retailer subject to overriding maximum ("ceiling") prices.

Now, the maximum prices are specified in the First Schedule, and are fixed in relation to certain main groups of descriptions, irrespective of size.

- (2) The maximum prices for footwear of Grades 1 and 2 are increased, and are now higher than the "ceiling" prices previously fixed.
- (3) The percentage additions for wider fittings and larger sizes have been increased.
