THE MILK (CONTROL AND RATIONING) (GUERNSEY) (SUSPENSION)
ORDER, 1950.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, the President of the States' Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities and the States Dairy Committee hereby make the following Order as regards the Island of Guernsey:-

1. During the operation of this Order Articles 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15 (2), 15 (3), 15 (4) and 20 of The Milk (Control and Rationing) (Guernsey) Order, 1947, as amended, shall cease to have effect but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof before this Order comes into operation. -1317
2. The General Licence dated 13th January, 1950, under The Milk (Control and Rationing) (Guernsey) Order, 1947 (a) is hereby revoked. S.I. 15 of 1950
3. This Order may be cited as The Milk (Control and Rationing) (Guernsey) (Suspension) Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 19th June, 1950.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order provides that until further notice The Milk (Control and Rationing) (Guernsey) Order, 1947, as amended (the Principal Order) shall have effect subject to certain modifications which, inter alia - -1317

- (a) enable milk retailers to sell milk free from the permit control imposed by Part 3 of the Principal Order.
- (b) enable consumers to obtain milk from any licensed milk retailer free from the requirement of registration.

Note 1. Consumers who are entitled to free milk by virtue of an authorisation issued by or on behalf of the Essential Commodities Committee will continue to obtain such milk from the retailer with whom they are registered for that purpose. In that connection the priority allowances to which they are entitled remain as under the Principal Order.

Note 2. Notwithstanding (b) above a consumer can only obtain milk from a retailer authorised to serve in the zone in which the consumer resides. If in doubt as to the retailers operating in their zone consumers should make enquiries at the States Dairy, St. Martin's.
