IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946.

The Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order,  
1949, Amendment No. 3 Order, 1950.

The Board of Administration, in pursuance of The Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders as follows:-

- (1) There shall be deleted from the First Schedule to the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated 3rd August, 1949, (a) the following item:-  
"Points-rationed food". *S.I. 1949 NO.45*
- (2) There shall be deleted from the second paragraph of the Delegation of Power to Grant Import Licences (No. 1) Order, 1949, dated 8th August, 1949, (b) the following item:-  
"Points-rationed food". *S.I. 1949 NO.46*
- (3) The Second Schedule to the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated 3rd August, 1949, (c) shall be amended as follows:- *S.I. 1949 NO.45.*  
  
Delete the item "Motor Vehicles, that is to say, any mechanically-propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on a road".  
  
and substitute therefor the following:-  
  
"Motor vehicles, that is to say any mechanically-propelled vehicle, other than a motor cycle, intended or adapted for use on a road".
- (4) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
- (5) This Order shall come into force on the 6th day of July, 1950, and may be cited as the "Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, Amendment No. 3 Order 1950".

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The effect of the above Order is that with effect from the 6th July, 1950, (i) motor cycles may now be exported to the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man, without restriction and (ii) foods which were subject to points-rationing may now be imported from the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man, without restriction.
