IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946.

The Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order,
1949, Amendment No. 4 Order, 1950.

The Board of Administration, in pursuance of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders as follows:-

- (1) The First Schedule to the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, dated 3rd August, 1949, (a) shall be amended as follows:-

Delete the item "Seed Grain and Seed Pulses of the following varieties:- Barley, Beans, Lentils, Maize, Oats, Peas, Rye, Wheat, where the consignment exceeds 28 lbs. in weight".

and substitute therefor the following:-

"Seed Grain of the following varieties:- Barley, Maize, Oats, Wheat, where the consignment exceeds 28 lbs. in weight".

- (2) There shall be deleted from the fourth paragraph of the Delegation of Power to Grant Import Licences (No. 1) Order, 1949, dated 8th August, 1949, (b) the following item:-

"Seed Pulses".

- (3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an enactment.
- (4) This Order shall come into force on the 13th day of July, 1950, and may be cited as the "Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, Amendment No. 4 Order 1950".

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The effect of the above Order is that from the 13th July, 1950, (i) Seed Pulses, (i.e. Beans, Lentils, Peas), may be imported from the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man without restriction and (ii) Rye Grain Seed may be imported from the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man, without restriction.
