The Export of Tomatoes (Grading) (Amendment No. 2) Order.

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of The Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, as extended by the Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, (Continuance) Law, 1949, hereby orders:-

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-paragraph (e) of paragraph 2 of The Export of Tomatoes (Grading) Order, 1950 (a) tomatoes of the White grade may be exported in containers which have not been lined with white tomato packing paper provided that a strip of white packing paper has been placed across the top of the container in such a manner that all the tomatoes therein are adequately covered.
2. This Order shall come into force on the 16th day of August, 1950.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

Owing to the shortage of white tomato packing paper on the Island, grower-packers and store-packers may, if their stocks of white paper are inadequate for the season, pack tomatoes of the White grade in unlined chips provided that a strip of white paper (approximately  $\frac{1}{4}$  sheet) is placed over the tomatoes.

This concession applies to the White Grade only.

It is essential that in any case, sufficient white paper should be retained for the Pink and White Grade.
