Revised by S.I. 10 of 1951.THE UTILITY CLOTH AND UTILITY HOUSEHOLD TEXTILES (MAXIMUM PRICES) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1950.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

PART I.MAXIMUM PRICES.

1. The maximum price to be charged in the course of the business of a retailer in respect of new utility goods shall be -

(1) in the case of cloth of a description contained in Column 1 of the Fourth Schedule hereto, the appropriate amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule with the addition of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of such amount;

(2) in the case of cloth (including lace and woven curtain net) to which paragraph (1) of this Article does not apply and household textiles (other than bedding) (hereinafter called "goods"), the aggregate of the following amounts:-

(a) the purchase price paid or agreed to be paid to the manufacturer or to the wholesaler, by the first purchaser (being a retailer);

(b) an amount equal to the appropriate percentage of such price specified in Column 2 of the First Schedule hereto; and

(c) an amount equal to $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the aggregate of the foregoing amounts;

Provided that in respect of goods described in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, the maximum prices of goods of a description specified in Column 1 of the appropriate Part of the relevant Related Schedule shall not exceed the appropriate amount specified in Column 3 of such Related Schedule with the addition of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of such amount.

2. The variations of overriding maximum prices specified in the appropriate Parts of any Related Schedule shall have effect as therein respectively provided.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order on a sale by retail -

(i) of any article of goods (not being cloth) the maximum price of which, computed in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order, does not exceed the sum of 5s., the maximum price shall be rounded to the nearest half-penny;

(ii) of any article of goods (not being cloth) the maximum price of which, computed as aforesaid, exceeds the sum of 5s., the maximum price shall be rounded to the nearest penny;

(iii) of goods (being cloth) the maximum price of which, per yard, computed in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order, does not exceed the sum of 5s., the maximum price per yard shall be rounded to the nearest half-penny;

- (iv) of goods (being cloth) the maximum price of which, per yard, computed as aforesaid, exceeds the sum of 5s., the maximum price per yard shall be rounded to the nearest penny:

Provided that in respect of goods described in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, the maximum price, when rounded, of goods of a description specified in Column 1 of the appropriate Part of the relevant Related Schedule shall not exceed the appropriate amount specified in Column 3 of such Related Schedule with the addition of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of such amount.

PART II.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

4. (1) A Related Schedule means any such Schedule (including any supplement thereto) issued by the Board of Trade and published by His Majesty's Stationery Office, mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto containing certain matters by reference to which maximum prices are to be computed for goods of the descriptions mentioned in the said Schedule against each such Schedule, which has been certified by the Board of Trade as a Related Schedule and which has been lodged with the Board of Trade and with the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities.
- (2) A number set out in Part II of the First Schedule hereto or in the Fourth Schedule hereto or in any Related Schedule in a column headed "specification number" refers to cloth or household textiles being utility goods described in relation to that number in any Schedule to any Order made by the Board of Trade.
- (3) The provisions of this Order shall not apply to second-hand utility goods.
5. (1) In this Order -
- "bedding" has the meaning assigned to it in The Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) Order, 1945;
- "the Board of Trade" means the Board of Trade of the United Kingdom;
- "household textiles" means textile articles (other than utility upholstery cloth and utility curtain cloth) of a kind used for domestic purposes, and tissues and fabrics, whether in the piece, shaped or partly made up, intended or designed for making such articles;
- "manufacturer" means any person, who carries out a process of manufacture, in relation to goods, or who procures or permits materials belonging to him to be subjected to any process whereby goods are produced;
- "maximum price" means the price payable before any deduction by way of discount, inclusive of all delivery charges; and "purchase price" means the price, inclusive of all delivery charges payable after all deductions by way of discount, other than cash or settlement discounts not exceeding five per cent; so, however, that in relation to maximum price and purchase price, no account shall be taken of delivery charges payable by the buyer;
- "utility goods" has the meaning assigned to it in The Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) Order, 1945.
- (2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

(3) The Orders mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

6. If any person -

(a) sells, agrees to sell, or offers for sale, any goods; or

(b) performs, agrees to perform or offers to perform, any service;

in contravention of the provisions of this Order, he shall be guilty of an offence under this Order.

7. This Order may be cited as The Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1950, and shall come into force on the 18th day of August, 1950.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

S.I. 86
(1949)

This Order revokes and re-enacts with amendments The Utility Cloth and Utility Household Textiles (Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1949, as amended. The principal amendments are:-

- (1) Retailers' maximum prices for utility woven wool apparel and pram rug cloth and woven pram rugs are no longer to be computed solely by reference to the purchase price and the permitted margin. Consequently the reference to Related Schedule No. 1J, which provided retailers' overriding maximum prices for these goods, is now omitted from the Second Schedule;
- (2) One profit margin only is now prescribed for all utility woven wool cloth, the rate being 33 1/3rd per cent;
- (3) A new Supplement, No. 1, to Related Schedule No. 5J which provides retailers' overriding maximum prices for utility household textiles, is brought into operation; the changes made by the introduction of this Supplement are indicated in the Explanatory Note issued therewith.
