THE SOAP (LICENSING OF MANUFACTURERS) (BAILIWICK OF
GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1950.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

Interpretation.

1. (1) In this Order -

"The Committee" means the States of Guernsey Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities;

"Soap" means any soap other than dental soap (dentrifrice), liquid soap, paste soap, shampoo powder, shaving soap, soft soap or any soap containing not more than 6 per cent of anhydrous soap;

"Manufacturer" includes milling and any other form of processing or treatment of soap;

"Pre-packed" means packed or made up in advance ready for retail sale in a wrapper or container;

"Buy" includes offer or agree to buy, and "sell" includes offer or agree to sell or expose for sale;

"Sale by retail" means any sale to a person buying otherwise than for the purpose of re-sale, but it does not include a sale to a trade user;

"Trade user" means a person using soap in the course of his business.

Licensing of Manufacturers.

2. Except under and in accordance with the terms of a licence or authorisation granted for the purposes of this Article by or on behalf of the Committee no person shall -

(a) engage in the manufacture of any soap;

(b) engage in the pre-packing of any soap unless he is either -

(i) the manufacturer thereof; or

(ii) a retailer pre-packing the soap for the purpose of retail sale by him on the premises on which it is pre-packed.

Directions, Licences and Authorisations.

3. (1) The provisions of this Order are subject to any directions which may at any time be given by or on behalf of the Committee and to any licence or authorisation which may be granted by or on behalf of the Committee under this Order.

(2) Every person holding a licence or authorisation granted under this Order shall comply with every condition imposed by such licence or authorisation.

Infringements.

4. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945.

Revocations, etc.

5. (1) The Soap (Licensing of Manufacturers and Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1950 (a) and the General Licences dated 19th July 1947 and 2nd August, 1950 (b) having effect thereunder are hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof. 1362
- (2) Every person shall notwithstanding the revocation of the said Order retain any record required to be kept by him thereunder until the expiration of one year from the date of the transaction to which it relates.

Commencement and Citation.

6. This Order may be cited as The Soap (Licensing of Manufacturers) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of September, 1950.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order replaces The Soap (Licensing of Manufacturers and Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1950.

The principal changes are:-

- (a) Soap is no longer subject to rationing.
- (b) Licences are not now required for the manufacture of dental soap (dentifrice), liquid soap, paste soap, shampoo powder, shaving soap, soft soap, or any soap containing not more than 6 per cent of anhydrous soap.
