THE APPAREL AND TEXTILES (GUERNSEY) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1950.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) Order, 1945, shall be amended by substituting for the First and Second Schedules thereto, the First and Second Schedules respectively to this Order.
 2. This Order may be cited as The Apparel and Textiles (Guernsey) (Amendment) Order, 1950, and shall come into force on the 21st day of November, 1950.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE

Controlled Goods.

1. Cloth, that is to say, cloth (whether or not subjected to any process of finishing) which is woven, knitted, netted or crocheted and of which the textile content is not mainly jute, hard hemp or asbestos, but excluding the goods specified in the Second Schedule.
2. Wearing apparel, that is to say, wearing apparel, including trimmings and accessories made of furskin (including any skin with fur, wool or hair attached) or of cloth, and including material or furskin as aforesaid shaped for making up into such wearing apparel, and including but without prejudice to the generality thereof, braces, gloves (except rubber gloves) and other handwear, handkerchiefs, footwear and headwear.
3. Hand knitting yarn.
4. Lace and lace net, that is to say, lace and lace net made on machines; embroidery on net or dissoluble fabric carried out on multiple needle shuttle embroidery machines, ornamental textiles of a like character other than braids, gimps and fringes; household goods made wholly or mainly of the aforesaid goods or any of them; hair nets of any description made on machines and other lace apparel (including handkerchiefs) not being apparel made up from lace or lace net.
5. Bedding, that is to say, mattresses of all kinds except un-upholstered mattresses; bolsters, pillows, cushions, down quilts and other household textile articles containing stuffing; sleeping bags containing stuffing.
6. Household textiles, that is to say, towels, glass cloths, kitchen cloths, blankets, sheets, pillow cases and table cloths.
7. Rugs.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

Goods excluded from Controlled Goods.

Goods excepted from Class 1.

Bolting cloth.

Carpeting.

Cloth weighing more than 16 ounces per square yard but not containing more than 15 per cent. of wool.

Woven fabrics (including ribbon and elastic) not more than 18 inches wide.

Fishing net.

Floor matting.

Inked ribbons for typewriting, duplicating, accounting and similar machines.

Lace and lace net.

Rags.

Wicks.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order substitutes a new definition of controlled goods in relation to the application of the utility mark.
