IMPORT AND EXPORT (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) LAW, 1946.

IMPORT AND EXPORT OF GOODS (CONTROL) (GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1949.

THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION, in pursuance of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, hereby orders as follows:-

1. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all goods are prohibited to be imported into the Island or to be exported from the Island or shipped as ships' stores.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall be taken to prohibit the importation or exportation of any goods under the authority of a licence granted by the Board of Administration or some other person or body of persons duly authorised by the said Board to grant such licences, or the shipment of any goods as ships' stores if the shipment of goods is permitted by the States Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities for use on board the ship, provided that all conditions attaching to the said licence or the said permission are complied with.
3. (1) Any licence granted by the Board of Administration or other authorised licensing authority for the importation into, or the exportation from, the Island of any goods may be modified or revoked at any time by the said Board or authority.  
(2) Any permission given by the States Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities for the shipment of any goods as ships' stores may be modified or revoked at any time by the said Committee.
4. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall be taken to prohibit the importation of any goods, other than goods of a description set out in the First Schedule to this Order, which are proved to the satisfaction of the States Supervisor or acting States Supervisor to have been consigned from the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick or the Isle of Man.
5. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall be taken to prohibit the exportation of any goods, other than goods of a description set out in the Second Schedule to this Order, to the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick or the Isle of Man.
6. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall be taken to prohibit:-
  - (1) The importation into Guernsey from the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick, or the Isle of Man, of unsolicited gifts sent to any person in Guernsey through the medium of the General Post Office; and
  - (2) The importation into Guernsey of gifts not being arms and ammunition, plumage, dangerous drugs or other articles which were subject to special prohibition or restriction by virtue of legislation passed before 1st September, 1939, from a place outside the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick, or the Isle of Man, subject to the following conditions:-

- (a) they shall be bona fide unsolicited gifts and shall not be imported as merchandise or for sale, or for commercial or professional use;
  - (b) they shall be clearly marked as gifts; and
  - (c) the weight shall not exceed 22 lbs. gross, whether the gifts are sent by post or otherwise.
- (3) The exportation from the Island as personal baggage of a quantity of wines and spirits not exceeding 10 ozs. and half a pound of tobacco or tobacco products per passenger.
7. No goods shall be unshipped, landed or put on shore, except at the Ports of St. Peter Port or St. Sampson or at a Customs Aerodrome within the meaning of the Laws for the time being governing the approval of Customs Aerodromes in the Island, and no goods shall be shipped, put off, or water-borne to be shipped, for exportation, except from such Ports or such a Customs Aerodrome as aforesaid.

(Article 5).

Household Furniture, that is to say, any article of furniture commonly used for domestic purposes.

Iron and Steel Scrap.

Motor Vehicles, that is to say, any mechanically-propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on a road.

Poultry (dead or alive).

Wines and Spirituous Liquors.

Tobacco and Tobacco Products.

IMPORT AND EXPORT CONTROL.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

Under the provisions of the Import and Export (Control) (Guernsey) Law, 1946, the States Board of Administration have issued the Import and Export of Goods (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949, which repeals and (with amendment) re-enacts in a consolidated form all Orders previously in operation under the Law, except the Importation of Figs (Control) (Guernsey) Order, 1949. Control exercised over the importation and exportation of certain goods into and from this Island as at the date of this Notice is accordingly as follows:-

I. Importation of Goods from and exportation to places outside the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man are prohibited except under licence issued by or on behalf of the States Board of Administration. The only exception is that:-

Gifts, other than articles subject to special prohibition or restriction by legislation passed before 1st September, 1939, may be imported without licence provided:-

- (a) that they are bona fide unsolicited gifts and marked as such and are not imported as merchandise or for sale or for commercial or professional use;
- (b) the gross weight does not exceed 22 lbs. whether the gifts are sent by post or otherwise.

II. Goods imported from or exported to the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick and the Isle of Man.

A. Imports.

The following goods may not be imported from the United Kingdom, Jersey, the other Islands of this Bailiwick or the Isle of Man except under licence issued by the following Committees or Board:-

Butter, Meat, Points-rationed food, Potatoes, and Wines and Spirituous Liquors (other than Wines and Spirituous Liquors being the produce of the United Kingdom, the Island of Jersey or the Isle of Man).	States Committee for the Control of Essential Commodities.

Wooden Doors.
