The Export of Tomatoes (1949) No. 4 Order.

The States Committee for Horticulture, under and by virtue of the Export of Tomatoes Law, 1949, for the purpose of ensuring the orderly and expeditious marketing of tomatoes from Guernsey in 1949, hereby orders -

## 1. For the purposes of this Order:-

"The Board" means the Guernsey Tomato Shipping Board constituted under the provisions of the Export of Tomatoes (1949) Order.

The expression "exported" shall for the purposes of this Order have the meaning attributed to it for the purposes of the Export of Tomatoes (1949) No. 2 Order by the Export of Tomatoes (1949) No. 3 Order, and the expression "export" shall be construed accordingly.

"New crop tomatoes" means tomatoes grown under glass and planted on or after the 15th day of June, 1949, and the expression "new crop tomatoes" is a description of such tomatoes for the purposes of this Order.

The expression "packer" shall have the same meaning as in the Export of Tomatoes (1949) Order.

2. No new crop tomatoes shall be exported through the agency of the Board unless they are packed in 12 pound packages carrying a label bearing the words "New Crop" and no tomatoes other than new crop tomatoes shall be exported bearing that label.

3. Every packer of new crop tomatoes exported through the agency of the Board shall, at or before the time of export of those tomatoes, deliver to the Board a consignment note, applying to those tomatoes only, stating the number of packages of each grade of those tomatoes exported by him on the day of export, and no consignment note relating to the export of tomatoes other than new crop tomatoes shall contain a reference to new crop tomatoes.

4. After the date of this Order the Board shall pay to the packer of tomatoes delivered to it for export, as the price of the tomatoes so delivered to it, a sum or sums calculated from time to time by taking the average price realised by the sale of those tomatoes and of all other tomatoes of the same grade and description exported under the provisions of the Export of Tomatoes (1949) Order on the same day, subject to the deductions set out in sub-paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d) of paragraph 4 of the Export of Tomatoes (1949) Order.

5. This Order shall come into force on the twentieth day of September, 1949.
