THE FLOUR CONFECTIONERY (CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICES)
(BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) (AMENDMENT NO. 3) ORDER, 1949.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. The Flour Confectionery (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1947, as amended, shall be further amended by substituting for paragraphs 5 and 6 of Part I of the Second Schedule thereto, the following paragraphs:-
 - "5. From the 27th November, 1949, until the 31st December, 1949, both dates inclusive, in the case of any cake in which the combined fat, sugar and dry egg solids content amounts to 40 per cent or more and which in its completed state contains not less than 1 lb. and not more than 4 lb. of edible ingredients and which is wholly covered on the top, or on the top and sides, with any one or more of the following substances, namely, sugar icing, almond marzipan and chocolate, and which is substantially decorated, the maximum price shall be calculated at a rate not exceeding four times the cost of the edible ingredients (to which may be added the actual cost, to the manufacturer of the cake, of any inedible decoration or ornamentation) or 4s. 8d. per lb. net (including the cost and the weight of any inedible decoration or ornamentation) whichever is the lesser.
 - 6. For the purpose of ascertaining the maximum price under paragraph 5 of this Part of this Schedule, where some or all of the edible ingredients were supplied by the person to whom the cake is sold by the manufacturer, the value of the ingredients so supplied (such value to be determined as provided in Article 4 (2) hereof) shall be deducted from four times the cost of all the ingredients (with the addition of the cost of any inedible decoration or ornamentation); and in any such case the maximum price shall be calculated at a rate not exceeding the amount arrived at after making such deduction or 4s. 8d. per lb. net whichever is the lesser."
- 2. The Flour Confectionery (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment No. 2) Order, 1948, dated 7th October, 1948, is hereby revoked.
- 3. This Order may be cited as The Flour Confectionery (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment No. 3) Order, 1949, and shall come into operation on the 27th day of November, 1949, and shall cease to have effect on the 1st day of January, 1950.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This amending Order provides that, from the 27th November, 1949, until the 31st December, 1949, cakes of a prescribed standard that weigh not less than one nor more than four pounds and that are both iced and decorated, may be sold at any price up to four times the cost of the edible ingredients plus the actual cost of any inedible ornaments, provided that the total price does not exceed 4s. 8d. a pound.

Special provision is made for those cases in which some or all of the ingredients of the cake are supplied by the customer.

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
