THE BREAD (CONTROL AND MAXIMUM PRICES) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY)
(AMENDMENT NO. 4) ORDER, 1949.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Bread (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1948, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:-

- (a) by deleting article 5 thereof (which restricts the sale of sliced bread and wrapped bread); and
 - (b) by inserting in Part I of the Second Schedule thereto (which sets out the maximum prices of bread) the following three additional paragraphs -

"3. On a sale by retail of bread that is completely wrapped and sealed in either waxed paper or cellulose film, the maximum price may be increased at the rate of one farthing per 14 oz. net weight of bread sold:

Provided that the seller shall at the time of such sale be able and willing to sell to any buyer, to the extent of that buyer's reasonable requirements, bread that is not so wrapped.

4. If, on a sale of bread, the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Order includes any fraction of a farthing, such fraction shall if equal to half a farthing or more be regarded as one farthing and shall otherwise be disregarded.

5. Except as aforesaid, no additional charge in respect of wrapping, packing or slicing shall be made or demanded by the seller on or in connection with any sale of bread."

2. This Order may be cited as the Bread (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment No. 4) Order, 1949, and shall come into operation on the 30th day of October, 1949.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order:-

- (1) removes the restriction on the buying and selling of sliced bread and wrapped bread; and
- (2) permits an addition, at the rate of one farthing for each fourteen ounces (net weight) of bread sold, to the maximum price of bread sold by retail in sealed wrappers made of waxed paper or cellulose film.
