THE FOOD (POINTS RATIONING) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY)
(AMENDMENT NO. 5) ORDER, 1949.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Food (Points Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1949, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:-

(a) by inserting immediately after the definition of fish in paragraph (1) of Article 1 thereof the following definition:-

"Imported quick frozen pre-cooked meat meal" means any open meat product imported and sold in a frozen cooked state and containing meat. For the purpose of this definition 'open meat product' and 'meat' shall have the meaning assigned to them by The Meat Products and Canned Meat (Control and Maximum Prices) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1949, as amended";

(b) by substituting for item 3 in the First Schedule thereto the following item:-

3. A coupon marked 'K', 'KK' or 'Points' in a Leave or Duty Ration Card R.B.8A.	3";

(c) by substituting for Part I of the Second Schedule thereto the part so numbered in the Schedule to this Order;

(d) by inserting immediately after Part I of the said Schedule the following part:-

"PART IA - Imported Quick Frozen Pre-Cooked Meat Meals.

<u>Description.</u>	<u>Equivalent number of Points.</u>
Imported quick frozen pre-cooked meat meals.	1 per 4 ozs. or part of 4 ozs.";

(e) by deleting from the said Schedule Part X thereof relating to cheese.

2. This Order may be cited as The Food (Points Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment No. 5) Order, 1949, and shall come into operation on the 6th day of November, 1949.

THE SCHEDULE.

PART I.

MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS

(OTHER THAN IMPORTED QUICK FROZEN PRE-COOKED MEAT MEALS).

(Canned, or packed in an airtight container made wholly or mainly of glass or earthen-ware, including meat and meat products which, having been so packed, have been removed from such container).

For the purpose of calculating the equivalent number of points for any container or weight of meat or meat product, if it should weigh less than one ounce it shall be treated as one ounce, otherwise a fraction of an ounce shall be disregarded.

SECTION B. - OTHER MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS (CONTD.)

Canned sausages, including canned kosher sausages (home produced or imported skinless or skin-on) but excluding canned sausages in brine. Any ready or prepared meal, home produced or imported, including any ready or prepared meal in a container labelled or embossed "Meat and Vegetables" or "M and V" but not including spaghetti and sausages in tomato sauce or vegetable and macaroni casserole with pork in tomato sauce.	6 per pound.
Canned rabbit. Canned sausages in brine Spaghetti and sausages in tomato sauce. Vegetable and macaroni casserole with pork in tomato sauce.	2 per pound.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This amending Order -

- (a) makes valid coupons marked "KK" or "Points" in a Leave or Duty Ration Card R.B.8A at a value of 3 points;
- (b) prescribes points values for imported quick frozen pre-cooked meat meals;
- (c) substitutes for the part of the Second Schedule to the principal Order dealing with meat and meat products a new part which -
 - (i) reduces the points values of ham loaf, veal loaf, canned veal and ham, canned veal and ham loaf, jellied or stuffed jellied veal or pork, jellied pork and veal, jellied beef, pressed veal, pressed pork and beef, pressed pork and veal, canned pork or pork brawn, canned rabbit, canned sausages in brine;
 - (ii) increases the points values of canned boneless chicken or turkey, canned meat puddings (including cottage pie);
 - (iii) provides that on the supply of certain canned meats otherwise than for household consumption or to catering establishments the prescribed points values shall be reduced by 10 per cent; and
 - (iv) provides for certain other changes in the method of determining the points values of meats and meat products;
- (d) frees imported blue vein, Stilton and Blue Cheshire cheese from points rationing.
