THE IMPORTED ANIMAL FEEDINGSTUFFS (RATIONING) (BAILLIWICK OF GUERNSEY) ORDER, 1949.

As Competent Authorities as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney and as regards the Island of Alderney respectively in relation to Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945, we hereby make the following Order:-

1. In this Order -

"Agricultural Committee" means as regards the Bailiwick of Guernsey excluding the Island of Alderney, the States of Guernsey Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries and as regards the Island of Alderney, the Alderney Agriculture Committee;

"Animal" means any ox, bull, cow, heifer, calf, sheep (including any ram, ewe or lamb) pig, sow, horse, pony, donkey, goat, rabbit or poultry;

"Brewers' grains" includes grains produced in the manufacture of malt extract or vinegar;

"Compound", "concentrate", "molassed feedingstuff" and "licensed concentrate" have the meanings assigned to them in The Feeding Stuffs (Manufacture) Order, 1949, of the United Kingdom;

"Distillers' grains" includes distillery dreg;

"Feeding meat and bone meal" means the product, containing not less than 40 per cent of albuminoids (protein) and not more than 4 per cent of salt, obtained by drying and grinding animal carcasses or portions thereof (excluding hoof and horn) and bone, to which no other matter has been added;

"Feeding meat meal" means the product, containing not less than 55 per cent of albuminoids (protein) and not more than 4 per cent of salt, obtained by drying and grinding animal carcasses or portions thereof (excluding hoof and horn) to which no other matter has been added;

"Grain or pulse" means barley, beans, dredge corn, oats, threshed home-grown peas, feeding peas or wheat, but does not include any grain or pulse which has been subjected to any process other than one or more of the following:- threshing, drying, cleaning, screening or dressing;

"Millers' offals" means the by-product obtained from milling together in the permitted proportions, for the production of flour in accordance with an approved specification, wheat and any authorised ingredients of flour. Such by-product shall not contain more than 4 per cent of other vegetable substances, and all such substances shall be substances extracted by the producer of the offals from the wheat and other ingredients in the process of cleaning. In this definition "permitted", "approved", and "authorised" mean respectively permitted, approved and authorised by the Minister of Food of the United Kingdom;

"Owner" shall be deemed to include the person authorised by the owner to obtain rationed feedingstuffs on his behalf;

"Poultry" includes domestic fowls, ducks, geese and turkeys;

"Rationed feedingstuff" means any substance or mixture of substances used as food for any animal (including any bird) any part of which has been imported into the Bailiwick of Guernsey and specified in the Schedule to this Order;

"Sale by retail" means any sale to a person buying otherwise than for the purpose of re-sale, and the expression "sell by retail" shall be construed accordingly;

"Sale by wholesale" means any sale to a person buying for the purpose of re-sale and the expression "sell by wholesale" shall be construed accordingly;

"Supply" and "acquisition" shall be construed as including agreeing or offering to supply or acquire and as so construed shall include the disposal and acquisition of -

- (1) ownership or any proprietary interest; or
- (2) the right to possession; or
- (3) possession whether or not accompanied by any disposal or acquisition of ownership or of any proprietary interest or of the right of possession.

"Wheat by-products" means any by-products obtained in the production of flour by milling and includes millers' offals and wheat offals and fine wheatfeed, straight run bran, coarse bran, fine bran, pollards, middlings and wheat germ;

"Wheat offals" means a product of wheat separated in the process of milling and containing not more than four per cent of vegetable substances other than wheat extracted from wheat in the process of cleaning by the maker of the offals in the production of flour.

2. Except under and in accordance with the terms of a general or special licence granted by the Agricultural Committee, no person shall sell rationed feedingstuffs by wholesale and a person to whom such a licence has been granted is hereinafter referred to in this Order as a "licensed wholesale merchant".
3. Except under and in accordance with the terms of a general or special licence granted by the Agricultural Committee, no person shall sell rationed feedingstuffs by retail and a person to whom such a licence has been granted is hereinafter referred to in this Order as a "licensed retail merchant".
4. The Agricultural Committee shall keep a register of all owners of animals in respect of which the supply of rationed feedingstuffs shall be authorised by it under the provisions of this Order.
5. The Agricultural Committee may by notice in the Gazette Officielle or by individual direction prescribe the form in or on which any application is to be made, notice given and records kept under the provisions of this Order and in or on such prescribed form may vary any information required to be shown in relation thereto under such provision.
6. Where the owner of any animals has declared to the Agricultural Committee the number of animals which he owns and on or after the coming into force of this Order any change is made in the number so declared then he shall, within seven days of such change, notify the Agricultural Committee in writing thereof.

Provided that in the case of poultry such notification need be made only where the number has increased or decreased as the case may be by ten or more since the submission of the previous notification to the Agricultural Committee.

7. An owner of animals shall obtain the rationed feedingstuffs to which he is entitled from time to time only from the licensed retail merchant with whom he is registered by the Agricultural Committee for rationed feedingstuffs.

8. For the purposes of Article 7 of this Order registration of an owner of animals shall be effected by the Agricultural Committee notifying in writing a licensed retail merchant that he is authorised to supply rationed feedingstuffs to the owner thereof.
9. The Agricultural Committee shall from time to time direct the quantity of rationed feedingstuffs to which each owner of animals shall be entitled in respect of each class of animals owned by him.
10. Except as permitted by or under the provisions of this Order or under the authority of a licence granted by or on behalf of the Agricultural Committee no licensed wholesale merchant and no licensed retail merchant shall supply rationed feedingstuffs to any person provided that nothing in this Order shall operate to prevent the supply of rationed feedingstuffs by a licensed wholesale merchant to a licensed retail merchant.
11. Every licensed wholesale merchant shall -
 - (a) keep a record in such form as the Agricultural Committee may from time to time direct showing details of all rationed feedingstuffs supplied by him; and
 - (b) when so required by the Agricultural Committee furnish such particulars and produce such books, accounts and documents relating to his dealing in and stock of rationed feedingstuffs as may be required by the Agricultural Committee.
12. Every licensed retail merchant shall -
 - (a) keep a record in such form as the Agricultural Committee may from time to time direct showing the name and address of every owner of animals registered with him for rationed feedingstuffs showing separately each class of animal and details of all rationed feedingstuffs supplied by him; and
 - (b) when so required by the Agricultural Committee furnish such particulars and produce such books, accounts and documents relating to his dealings in and stocks of rationed feedingstuffs as may be required by the said Committee.
13. Infringements against this Order or against any direction given thereunder are offences against The Defence (General) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1945.
14. The Imported Animal Feeding Stuffs (Rationing) (Guernsey) Order, 1948, dated 27th February, 1948, is hereby revoked.
15. This Order may be cited as The Imported Animal Feedingstuffs (Rationing) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 1949, and shall come into force on the 14th day of December, 1949.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order supersedes The Imported Animal Feedingstuffs (Rationing) (Guernsey) Order, 1948.

The principal changes are -

- (1) The provisions of the Order are extended to include the Island of Alderney;
- (2) Rye is now unrationed;
- (3) Various feedingstuffs are re-named and new items are included in the Schedule of Rationed Feedingstuffs.
