

**The Tattooing, Piercing, Acupuncture and Electrolysis
(Prescribed Fees) (Guernsey and Alderney)
Regulations, 2014**

THE HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 5(1)(a) and (b) and 19 of the Tattooing, Piercing, Acupuncture and Electrolysis (Guernsey and Alderney) Law, 2000^a, section 1 of the Fees, Charges and Penalties (Guernsey) Law, 2007^b and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:-

Application fees.

1. The fees payable on submission of an application for registration of a person or any premises under the Law are specified in the Schedule.

Annual fees.

2. (1) The fee payable annually by a person registered under the Law

and the fee payable annually in respect of any premises registered under the Law are specified in the Schedule.

(2) The annual fees mentioned in paragraph (1) are due and payable on or before the 30th June, 2015, and subsequently, each anniversary of that date.

(3) For the avoidance of doubt, the fee payable annually in respect of any premises registered under the Law is in addition to the fee payable annually by a person registered under the Law.

Interpretation.

3. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context requires otherwise, "the Law" means the Tattooing, Piercing, Acupuncture and Electrolysis (Guernsey and Alderney) Law, 2000.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^c applies to the interpretation of these Regulations.

(3) Any reference in these Regulations to an enactment is a reference thereto as from time to time amended, re-enacted (with or without modification), extended or applied.

Revocation.

4. The Tattooing, Piercing, Acupuncture and Electrolysis (Prescribed Fees) Regulations, 2001^d are revoked.

Extent.

5. These Regulations have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.


Citation.

FEEES PRESCRIBED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LAW

Regulations 1 and 2(1)

Section 5(1)(a)	Application for registration of a person	£55
Section 5(1)(a)	Application for registration of any premises	£100
Section 5(1)(b)	Annual fee payable by a person registered under the Law	£35
Section 5(1)(b)	Annual fee payable in respect of any premises registered under the Law	£100

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations prescribe fees payable in respect of applications for registration of a person or premises under the Tattooing, Piercing, Acupuncture and Electrolysis (Guernsey and Alderney) Law, 2000. These Regulations also prescribe fees payable annually by a person registered under the Law, and additional fees payable annually in respect of each premises registered under the Law.

The Tattooing, Piercing, Acupuncture and Electrolysis (Prescribed Fees) Regulations, 2001 are revoked by these Regulations.

These Regulations come into force on the 1st January, 2015.
