WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His

Commission dated the Fifth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and seven, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts, to hold on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be so authorized by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further on His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorized in manner aforesaid :

And whereas there was this day read at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission, a Report to His Majesty from the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Guernsey and Jersey, dated the 19th day of March, 1907, in the words following, viz. :—

“ YOUR MAJESTY having been pleased, by Your General Order of Reference of the 24th day of January, 1901, to refer unto this Committee the humble Petition of the States of the Island of Guernsey, dated the 20th day of February, 1907, setting forth 1. That on the 14th day of November 1904 Your Majesty was graciously pleased to accord Your Royal Sanction to a law intituled ‘Loi relative à l'Entretien des Voies Publiques.’ Your Majesty's Order to that effect was duly registered on the Records of the Island on the 26th day of November 1904. 2. That difficulties have been experienced in carrying out in detail some of the provisions of the said law. And in order to obviate the same a Committee of the States to whom is entrusted the drawing up of the ‘Cadastre,’ referred to in the said law, recommended that the Royal Court should be

armed with authority to frame such Ordinances as might from time to time be found necessary for regulating the levy of the Tax called Tax in lieu of 'Equivalent' imposed by the said Law. That on the 9th day of January, 1907, the States adopted the said recommendation, and authorized the President to present a humble Petition praying Your Majesty to give Your Royal Sanction to the same; and most humbly praying that Your Majesty would be graciously pleased to confirm the said Resolution of the States, and to order and direct that the Royal Court of the Island should have authority from time to time to frame such ordinances as they might deem necessary for carrying into execution the provisions of the law intituled 'Loi relative à l'Entretien des Voies Publiques' so far as the same relate to the levying of the Tax known as the Tax in lieu of 'Equivalent':

“THE LORDS OF THE COMMITTEE, in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference, have this day taken the said Petition into consideration, and do agree humbly to report, as their opinion, to Your Majesty, that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to confirm the said Resolution of the States, of the 9th day of January, 1907, and authorize the Royal Court of the Island from time to time to frame such Ordinances as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of the law intituled 'Loi relative à l'Entretien des Voies Publiques,' approved by Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 14th day of November, 1904, so far as the same relate to the levying of the Tax known as the Tax in lieu of the 'Equivalent'.”

NOW, THEREFORE, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by writing

under His Majesty's Sign Manual, has taken the said Report into consideration, and doth, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, approve the same, and order and direct that the Royal Court of Guernsey be empowered to frame such Ordinances as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of the said Law intituled "Loi relative à l'Entretien des Voies Publiques," approved by Order of His Majesty in Council of the 14th day of November, 1904, so far as the same relate to the levying of the Tax known as the Tax in lieu of the "Equivalent":

And His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, being authorized as aforesaid, both, by and with the like advice, on His Majesty's behalf, further direct that this Order be entered upon the Register of the Island of Guernsey, and observed accordingly. And the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Guernsey, the Bailiff and Jurats, and all other His Majesty's Officers, for the time being, in the said Island, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
