

### **Ordonnance relative à l'Expédition de Fleurs.**

La Cour, vu l'approbation des Etats, ouïes les conclusions des Officiers du Roi, a renouvelé comme Ordonnance permanente les dispositions de l'Ordonnance provisoire relative à l'Expédition de Fleurs, passée le 10 mars 1928, de laquelle Ordonnance la teneur suit :

Attendu que les frais des Compagnies de Chemin de Fer pour le transport de fleurs de cette Ile sont calculés sur le poids brut des marchandises, y compris l'emballage et les boîtes et paquets contenant telles marchandises ;

Attendu que le manque de la part des consignataires de déclarer le vrai poids brut des dites marchandises tend à causer du délai, des disputes et des inconvénients dans l'exportation et le transport de tels produits ;

La Cour, ouïes les conclusions des Officiers du Roi, a ordonné et ordonne que les règlements suivants rédigés en anglais auront force de loi en cette Ile :—

1. In this Ordinance the words "Carrier" and "Consignor" shall be deemed to include their respective agents and servants. Définitions.

2. Every consignment of baskets, boxes or packages containing flowers delivered to a Carrier for export shall, except as otherwise agreed in writing, be accompanied by a consignment note on which shall be stated by the Consignor Regulations for Export of Flowers.

- (a) the full names and addresses of the Consignor and the consignee ;
- (b) the station or place of destination ;
- (c) the gross weight of the baskets, boxes or packages inclusive of packing ;
- (d) the number of such baskets, boxes or packages and the nature of their contents.

3. The gross weight so stated by the Consignor as aforesaid in respect of any such baskets, boxes, packages or consignments which are accepted by the Carrier without reserve, shall, as between the Consignor and the Carrier, be deemed to be the actual gross weight thereof unless and until the contrary is proved.

4. A Carrier may delay the acceptance for carriage of baskets, boxes or packages of flowers for export of which the gross weight is not clearly indicated on such consignment note or other document referring thereto and may give preference and priority to those baskets, boxes and packages of which the gross weight is clearly indicated on the consignment notes or other documents referring thereto.

5. A Carrier to whom baskets, boxes or packages of flowers for export are offered for carriage may at his discretion have the whole or any part of any load or consignment so offered weighed and for that purpose may have any load or consignment removed from its position in the line of vehicles or elsewhere and in the meanwhile may proceed to accept other consignments provided nevertheless that such load or consignment if so offered before the closing-time fixed for acceptance of such goods shall not be outshipped in consequence of the delay thereby incurred.

6. Where the weight of any baskets, boxes or packages of flowers for export, which is indicated on any such Consignment Note, or other document

required by the carrier, is less than the actual 1932.  
gross weight of such baskets, boxes, packages or  
consignment, inclusive of packing, the Consignor Penalty for  
infraction.  
shall on conviction be liable to a fine, at the dis-  
cretion of the Court, not exceeding £10.
