

Law for the Protection of cruelty to Animals

Meeting held 5th October, 1932

It is forbidden

- (a) to work a horse or other animal with sore shoulders or other wounds
- (b) working animals in an unfit state, from lameness, weakness, old age or bad condition
- (c) overloading, overdriving or overriding any animal
- (d) brutal ill usage by flogging
- (e) starvation or keeping animals without proper food.

If any person acts in contravention of these Articles he shall be liable on conviction in respect of a first offence to a fine of £1 10/- and a second offence to a fine of £1 sterling and each subsequent offence to a fine of £3 sterling.

NOTE:

Although referred to as a Law, this item is believed to have had effect as an Ordinance in the absence of any relevant Order in Council.
