**The Immigration (Work Permit Fee) (Bailiwick of
Guernsey) Order, 2016**

Coming into operation

11th July, 2016

THE COMMITTEE FOR HOME AFFAIRS, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 33(1) of the Immigration Act 1971^a as extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey by the Immigration (Guernsey) Order 1993^b, hereby makes the following Order:-

Fee for work permit.

1. The fee to be paid by an employer for the issue of a work permit is set out in the Schedule.

Interpretation.

2. (1) In this Order –

"**commencement date**" means the date specified in article 6 for this Order to come into force,

"**the Committee**" means the Committee for Home Affairs, and

"**work permit**" includes a duplicate or replacement work permit.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^c applies to the interpretation of this Order.

Revocation of Order of 2011.

3. The Immigration (Work Permit Fee) (No. 2) (Guernsey) Order, 2011^d is revoked.

Transitional provisions.

4. (1) The fee prescribed by article 1 does not apply in relation to the issue of a work permit in any of the following circumstances –

- (a) where an application for a work permit was made to the Home Department or the Committee before the commencement date, or
- (b) where it is necessary to issue a replacement work permit as a result of the employer providing incorrect information to the Home Department or the Committee before the commencement date.

(2) The fee for the issue of a work permit in either of the circumstances described in paragraph (1) is to be determined as if –

- (a) this Order had not come into force, and
- (b) the Immigration (Work Permit Fee) (No. 2) (Guernsey) Order, 2011 had not been revoked.

Citation.

5. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Work Permit Fee) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Order, 2016.

SCHEDULE
FEE FOR WORK PERMIT

Art. 1

Type of work permit	Fee
First issue of a work permit valid for a period of one month or less.	£50
First issue of a work permit valid for a period of more than one month but not exceeding 3 years.	£300
First issue of a work permit valid for a period exceeding 3 years.	£500
Issue of a duplicate work permit in any case where the work permit is reported as lost, stolen or damaged.	£20
Issue of a replacement work permit where necessary as a result of the employer providing incorrect information to the Committee.	£100

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order sets out various fees to be paid by an employer for the issue of a work permit in respect of a non-European Economic Area national.

Article 1 of this Order prescribes the applicable fees for work permits, as set out in the Schedule. Apart from the fees payable for the first issue of a work permit, the Schedule also sets out the fee to be paid in cases where a duplicate work permit is issued to replace a lost, stolen or damaged work permit, and the fee to be paid where a replacement work permit is necessary as a result of the employer providing incorrect information.

Article 2 of this Order sets out the interpretation provision.

Article 3 of this Order revokes the Immigration (Work Permit Fee) (No. 2) (Guernsey) Order, 2011. The provisions of that Order are superseded by this

Order.

Article 4 sets out transitional provisions.

Articles 5 and 6 are the citation and commencement provisions respectively.

This Order comes into force on the 11th July, 2016.
