**The Civil Contingencies (Contingency Planning)
(Information Arrangements) (Bailiwick of Guernsey)
Regulations, 2017**

THE CIVIL CONTINGENCIES AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 3 and 19 of the Civil Contingencies (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2012^a and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:-

Committee for Home Affairs to maintain arrangements to provide information.

1. (1) The Committee for Home Affairs ("the Committee") shall maintain arrangements to warn the public, and to provide information and advice to the public, in circumstances where an emergency is likely to occur or has occurred.

(2) A person who holds a licence granted under Part I of the Telecommunications Law (a "Licensee") shall co-operate with the Committee, as far as is reasonably practicable, in connection with the Committee's performance of the duty set out in subparagraph (1), in particular by providing the Committee with that Licensee's subscriber data (or such parts thereof as are specified by the Committee), in such form and at such times, as the Committee may from time to time specify.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context requires otherwise –

"the Committee": see paragraph 1(1),

"emergency" has the meaning given in the Civil Contingencies (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2012,

"enactment" includes a Law, an Ordinance and any subordinate legislation and includes any provision or portion of a Law, an Ordinance or any subordinate legislation,

"Licensee": see paragraph 1(2),

"subordinate legislation" means any regulation, rule, order, rule of court, resolution, scheme, byelaw or other instrument made under any statutory, customary or inherent power and having legislative effect, but does not include an Ordinance,

"subscriber data" means mobile subscriber number and fixed line number and associated address data held by a Licensee relating to persons in the Bailiwick of Guernsey who have a contract with that Licensee to receive telecommunications services operated by that Licensee,

"the Telecommunications Law" means the Telecommunications (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2001^b, and

"telecommunications services" has the meaning given in the


(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^c applies to the interpretation of these Regulations throughout the Bailiwick.

(3) Any reference in these Regulations to an enactment is a reference thereto as from time to time amended, re-enacted (with or without modification), extended or applied.

Citation and commencement.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Civil Contingencies (Contingency Planning) (Information Arrangements) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Regulations, 2017, and shall come into force on the 27th September, 2017.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations are made under Part 2 of the Civil Contingencies (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2012 ("the Law"), and place a duty on the Committee for Home Affairs to maintain arrangements to warn the public and provide information to the public if an emergency under the Law is likely to occur or has occurred. They come into force on the 27th September, 2017.
