The Public Holidays (Alderney) Ordinance, 2004

THE STATES OF ALDERNEY, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 46 and 47 of, and paragraph (o) of Schedule 2 to, the Government of Alderney Law, 1987, as amended^a, hereby order: –

Public holidays in 2004 and 2005.

1. Without prejudice to the provisions of the Bank Holidays (Alderney) Ordinance, 1988^b, Tuesday, the 28th December 2004 and Monday, the 3rd January 2005 shall be public holidays.

Amendment of 1988 Ordinance.

2. In the Bank Holidays (Alderney) Ordinance, 1988 –

- (a) in the title,
- (b) in the heading for section 1, and
- (c) in section 1,

for "bank" substitute "public".

Citation.

3. This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Holidays (Alderney) Ordinance, 2004.
